<u>St. Mark Altar Server Activity</u> – Manny Rosales confirmed with Steve Irick that the altar servers unanimously voted to go to Fat City, rather than a Rockies game. There are 26 altar servers. With the cost being \$12.95 on a weekend, this is still within the \$500 budget discussed. As this was in last year's budget, a motion was made to approve \$500 for this activity. After discussion about where in the budget it would originate, donations were decided. The motion was

Citadel Evangelization/Capuchin Order Support – Mike Melo indicated that the council committed \$1/month/member to support this evangelization. What is the status? A dollar per member, per month, is \$12 annually and will help support the excellent work being done at the Citadel mall in Colorado Springs. With everyone's financial support, they may be able to move to the larger store next door... A collection was taken up from the members present. They need our help. Now that we have help from the members present, how do we involve those not at the meeting. A newsletter article was suggested. Also, tracking the goal and progress was mentioned. 
