## **Hurricane Relief Efforts - Thank You**

Our Jurisdiction, like Alabama and Louisiana, has suffered much as a result of hurricane Katrina. Donations made in the name of charity have assisted greatly in our recovery efforts.

On September 13, 2005, I had the honor to host a visit by our Supreme Knight, Mr. Carl A. Anderson. He assured me that the entire Order had us in our prayers and financial assistance would be forth coming. Little did I know at that time how many of our Knights had been affected by the storm. Nor did I have an idea how many churches and Catholic schools had been either destroyed or severely damaged.

Thanks to donations from Knights of Columbus Charities, Inc., State Jurisdictions, individual Districts and Councils, Mississippi Knights and their families have received over \$315,000 in financial aid. In addition, truckloads of much needed relief items have been sent to our area and thousands of volunteer hours have been given to help restore the lives of our members, parishioners, and Catholic school children.

Many prayers of Thanksgiving have been said and many more will follow as we try to express our gratitude for the assistance that has been given. Your contributions to Councils 12166 in Pascagoula and 12271 at the Sea Bee Base in Gulfport, and Sacred Heart Elementary School in D'Iberville will go a long way in assisting them.

A special thanks goes out to **Brother Chris Kennedy** for his efforts in coordinating with us to ensure the donations were sent to those in the most need.

May God shine upon you and the members of your Council. We will pray for your council's future success. If there is anything we can do to return the favor, please do not hesitate to contact me.
