










# The Rosary Walk is Finished!












While the instructions differ from device to device, this is generally quite simple, for example:

#### IPhones/iPads:

- Go into settings
- Select Mail, Contacts, Calendars
- Select Add Account
- Select Other
- Select Add Subscribed Calendar
- Press Next
- After validation completes, press Save

You'll now be able to see the calendar on your device, but you will not be able to edit the events.

Please try these out and let me know if you have any problems. Can someone with an Andriod device, please reply with the steps for adding on one of those?

In addition, can you help me keep the calendar up-to-date and improve it by doing the following:

- 1. Let me know about any mistakes or omissions.
- 2. Provide me with the following detail to include on an event - Start and end times, location and contact for the person running the event.



He initially produced 7 quintales (quintal is 100 lbs) of pergamino coffee, but now produces 25 quintales. He has increased his production through the training and support offered through the cooperative and has improved the living conditions of his 5 children, who are now able to go to school. With the implemenation of the coffee roaster project, he will earn even more.

#### This year instead of Walking we put our foot down and made a stand against teen pregnancy after Prom.

We know you dedicate your time, talent and treasure to Alternatives because you too believe in our mission and have lovingly been our voice and Ambassador to your church, high school and home. And we need you now more than ever.
