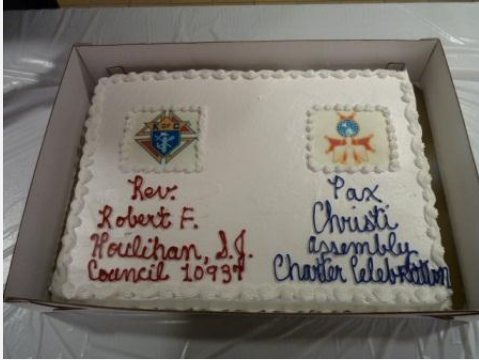

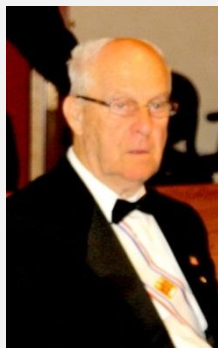
### History of Council 10937

our society; to be good stewards of the many gifts God entrusted to us."

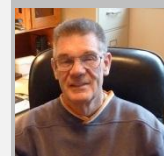

### **40 Days For Life**

40 Days For Life began in Texas with one hour of prayer. There are now 440 cities in the US and 13 countries which participate in 40 Days For Life campaigns in the effort to save lives. Since then, through efforts of participants, 5928 babies have been saved from abortion, 23 abortion centers have been shut down and 69 abortion workers have experienced

conversions and have left the abortion industry. Our participation has truly made a difference. The next campaign starts September 26th and runs through November 4th. I am begging all Knights to take a few minutes each day during the campaign to read the intention of the day and the accompanying prayer which I will forward to all Knights thru our Yahoo e-mail service. If you possibly are able to fast a few days in addition to your prayers, this campaign may be the most successful yet.

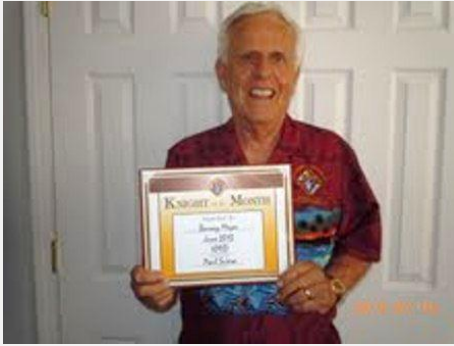

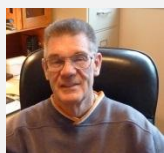
