Brothers:

On November 6th, our nation will go to the polls to elect those who will represent us at the national, state and local levels of government. We Knights have always taken seriously our civic responsibility to participate in the election process, and to encourage others to do so as well. In *Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship*, the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops declared, "In the Catholic Tradition, responsible citizenship is a virtue, and participation in political life is a moral obligation."

In this spirit, and in solidarity with our bishops and priests, I ask you to cast your vote in November, and to encourage your family and friends to vote as well. But this year, I'd like to ask you to do even more: please participate in our "Nonpartisan National Get Out the Vote Program" designed to ensure that your brother Knights, fellow parishioners and others in the community are all able to get to the polls on November 6th. Many people, especially the elderly and the handicapped, are not able to drive themselves to the polls, and need our help in getting there.

I ask that Grand Knights appoint a "Get Out the Vote Program" coordinator for your council. He should be responsible for organizing and coordinating transportation efforts on Election Day, and will serve as your council's main contact person. Next, sign up volunteers for Election Day among your council members, and have someone on call to provide transportation during the entire time the polls are open in your community.

Please promote this program at your October meeting, and through all available means of communication — your council newsletter, e-mail list and Web site, and in your parish bulletin. Ask your pastor to make an announcement

from the pulpit about your “Get Out the Vote Program” initiative during Masses on the weekend of November 3rd— 4th. To help you get the word out, sample documents — a bulletin insert and a pulpit announcement – are available at www.kofc.org/vote.

Also available at that website is a news release designed to be sent to your local diocesan newspaper

I am making a similar request of Fourth Degree Faithful Navigators, and invite you to coordinate your efforts with them.

Your work can make a big difference in voter turnout this year, and I thank you in advance for making it possible for everyone who wants to vote to do so. Get out the vote!

Responding to Americans' growing frustration with campaign rhetoric and the tone of the national discourse, the Knights of Columbus has launched a national, non-partisan initiative to give voice to Americans' desire for civility in public discourse.

A new website and a series of full-page national newspaper ads - beginning with an ad in the July 26th edition of USA TODAY - encourages readers nationwide to sign the online petition at CivilityinAmerica.org. 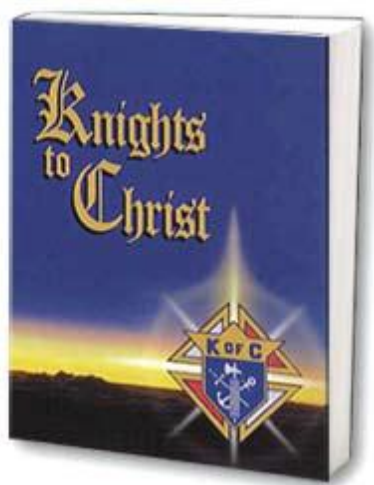

40 Days For Life

40 Days For Life began in Texas with one hour of prayer. There are now 440 cities in the US and 13 countries which participate in 40 Days For Life campaigns in the effort to save lives. Since then, through efforts of participants, 5928 babies have been saved from abortion, 23 abortion centers have been shut down and 69 abortion workers have experienced conversions and have left the abortion industry. Our participation has truly made a difference.

The campaign is currently under way and runs through November 4th. I am begging all Knights to take a few minutes each day during the campaign to read the intention of the day and the accompanying prayer which I will forward to all Knights thru our Yahoo e-mail service. If you possibly are able to fast a few days in addition to your

prayers, this campaign may be the most successful yet.

9. Please pray for our clients who need material assistance. Pray as Alternatives helps to guide them to the many community resources available, that these women will seek out resources and receive the needed help.

10. Please pray that God will help a client accept her pregnancy and remove from her any guilt for not wanting this baby. Pray that God would ease her financial burdens and provide for her family.

11. Praise the Lord that an abortion-minded client has chosen to carry her pregnancy and parent her child. Pray that God opens doors for the resources she needs during her pregnancy. Praise the Lord that the father of the baby has decided to be a positive support and encouragement for this client.

12. Please pray that a client and her boyfriend will be lead to our Father through a challenging experience they have been through.

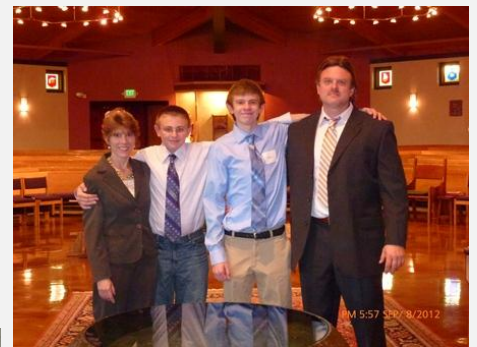

Lecturer Message

The Rev. Robert F. Houlihan S.J. Educators Series, Number 4.0

Since this is an “educators” series, there is a need to focus our efforts

to find truth through critical examination of all sides of the issues presented. Thus, to reexamine one topic previously discussed, Ben again considered the Cristero War. Much of the motivation portrayed in the movie might not have been as pristine or spiritual as was depicted. Motivations certainly varied on both sides. General Enrique Gorostieta, for instance, joined the revolution for money and ambition and in fact was anticlerical and a 33rd degree Mason. On the other side, why the government's violent suppression of the Church? The government thought of the Church as a leech which for decades sucked the life blood out of Mexican society. Huge buildings, wealth and opulence of the Church, little institutional help for the downtrodden masses, little institutional help for those in poverty, caused the government to view the Church as part of the problem, not as a solution to the problem. They also considered the Church a major threat to their power base.

Ben will continue to attempt to provide a critical, analytical and balanced approach to the Educators Series as is the Jesuit tradition.
