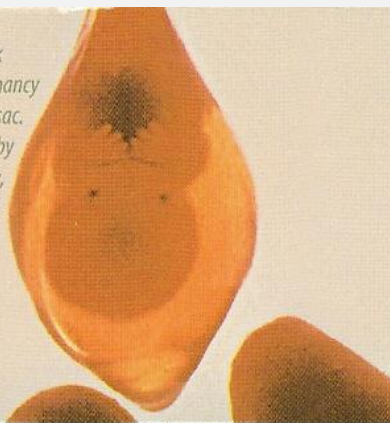

was held Friday, October 19, 2012 at the Broadmoor. About 500 people attended including State dignitaries and clergy from every corner of the Colorado Springs Diocese. The event was hosted by Bishop Sheridan. Pax Christi and Council 10937 were represented by Father Brian, Mike and Denise McGinnis, and Herb and Vonnie Engler. It was an enjoyable but moving evening. The highlight was a women's experience of life after an abortion. The shame, regret, anger, isolation, depression, loss of faith and relationship with God. An aspect of abortion that is often overshadowed by the death of an unborn child.

Precious Feet - The exact size and shape of an unborn baby's feet 10 weeks after conception.

At no time in your life does more growth and change occur than in the first nine months before birth. Here are the amazing milestones of that time in your life:

1st Day: Conception: Of the 200,000,000 sperm that try to penetrate the mother's egg cell, only one succeeds.¹ At that very moment, a new and unique individual is formed. All of the inherited features of this new person are already determined.

18-20 Days: The foundations of the brain, spinal cord, and nervous system are laid.²

21 Days: The heart begins to beat.³ A day later the eyes begin to develop. The earliest stages of the ears are now present.⁴



28-32 Days: Two tiny arms make their appearance and budding legs follow two days later.¹¹ The beginnings of the mouth take shape.⁵ The nose starts to develop.⁶

42 Days: The brain is now divided into 3 parts — one to experience emotion and understand language, one for hearing and one for seeing.⁷

44 Days: Facial muscles develop.⁸ 99% of muscles are present.⁸

7 Weeks: Spontaneous movement begins. The baby then develops a whole collection of moves over the next 4 weeks including hiccupping, frowning, squinting, furrowing the brow, and sucking.⁹

8 Weeks: The baby is now well-proportioned, and about the size of a thumb. Every organ is present. The liver is making blood, the kidneys function, and the heart beats steadily.¹⁰

10 Weeks: The number of connections between nerves and muscles has tripled since last week.¹¹

12 Weeks: The baby swallows and responds to skin stimulation.¹²

4 Months: The baby can grip with hands, make a fist, swim, and turn somersaults.¹²

7 Months: The eyelids begin to reopen, preparing to see the outside world.¹³


9 1/2 Months: The child triggers labor and birth occurs, an average of 264-270 days after conception.¹⁴



Around 1970, physician Dr. Russell Sacco took a striking photo of the perfectly formed feet of a 10-week unborn child it was published world-wide. In 1974, it inspired Mrs. Virginia Evers to create the "Precious Feet" lapel pin, identical in size and shape to an unborn baby's feet at just 10 weeks after conception. They are used by literally millions of people world-wide to demonstrate the humanity of the unborn.

Hurricane Sandy

The Whole World Market is now history for another year. It has come to my attention that there is some coolness toward the market because it does not make money for the parish. This may be because many people do not understand what the Whole World Market is

and what it stands for. Well, here it is:

WHAT IS THE WHOLE WORLD MARKET?

The Whole World Market offers products from non-profit and fair trade organizations from our community and worldwide. The sale of these global gifts support programs in education, healthcare, food sustainability, housing, self-protection, and financial help.

Pax Christi does not charge vendors a "table fee" or take a percentage of their sales; instead, the church pays for all of the costs associated with the market. All profits go back to the organizations to sustain their programs.

This bears repeating, the market is not a money maker for the parish. It is a market that sees all sales proceeds go directly the charities. "There is no overhead, administration costs or kickbacks. What other charity event can say that. We, as Knights, having Charity as our cornerstone, should support the Whole World Market 100% since we all aspire to achieve the same goals.

What other parish event can even come close to attaining what the market achieves. The past two years we raised over \$50,000 each year for these non-profit, fair-trade organizations, and we do it in just one and one half days.

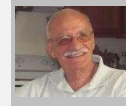

40 Days For Life is almost finished. Thanks to all who took part in the daily meditation. If you missed it, don't despair, you can still take part by accessing the web site and starting at the beginning.

Alternatives Pregnancy Center provides a Mobile Testing Clinic that travels throughout the Denver-Metro area and offers free and confidential testing for women. The following services are available from the mobile unit:

Counseling

Limited Ultrasounds

STD Testing & Treatment- in Castle Rock

What a treat to have the mobile unit available for tours at Pax Christi after the 8:30 and 10:30 masses, Sunday, October 14th. About 20 parishioners toured the bus and found it to be a reassuring and comfortable facility in which women could feel secure and safe while receiving concerned guidance and counseling. Particularly valuable in choosing life for their unborn child is the availability of the ultrasound. It is estimated that 90% of pregnant women who have seen an ultrasound of their baby, choose life for their child. Thanks to Alternative Pregnancy Center for introducing parishioners to their facility and for providing invaluable information about their mission and how they accomplish it. Particularly we thank Mary McGovern who spoke after each of the masses.

Alternatives Pregnancy Center – Prayer Requests – October 30, 2012

1. Please pray for our clients whose pregnancy tests are negative. Pray that they will develop a desire to make the decision to abstain from sex until marriage, even though they have been sexually active. Please pray that these women and their boyfriends would begin to see the effects of unhealthy sexual decisions on the health of their whole-person. Lord, please give discernment and wisdom to these couples.

2. Please pray for a client who is considering abortion. Pray that the Lord speaks to her through many, showing her a life-giving alternative, and that she is open to exploring her other options. Lord, we pray that you place loving and supportive people in her life and guide the father of the baby to come alongside this woman with encouragement.

3. Please pray for a client who is hurting from a past relationship situation. God, please lead her to an effective long-term counselor who can help lead her out of her self-destructive behavior. We pray she will be surrounded with godly women to love her as You do.

4. Please pray for a single mother who is struggling to leave an unhealthy relationship. Pray she will have the courage to set healthy personal boundaries. Lord, please surround her with your love and with people who

will shower her with support through this journey.

5. Praise the Lord for a couple who is choosing the life-giving option to carry and parent their child. Pray that as they move forward and tell their friends and family, that this news would be received with grace and love. Lord, grant this couple strength to press forward, provide a strong support system for them, and Lord, please replace their fears with joy, hope and excitement for this next chapter of their lives.

6. Please pray for a client's sweet baby boy. Lord, bring healing and strength to his little body and grant peace to his mother.

7. Please pray for a client who is in the midst of a relationship that is struggling. Pray that the Lord brings reconciling and forgiveness for past hurts and brings a renewed sense of security for their future as a family. Lord, please guide them back to your heart and into a church community that will help cover them with your peace.

8. Please pray for a client who has experienced the loss of abortion and who is hurting with grief. Pray that she continues to seek counseling. Lord, help prepare the hearts of those in her life as she tells them what has happened.

9. Please pray for several clients who have struggled through miscarriages. Pray that the Lord would grant them healing, peace, and understanding. Lord, hold these women close to you as they struggle with their losses.

10. Please pray for protection for a client who has unsafe people around her. Pray that she can find a church home where people can come alongside her and provide safety, acceptance, and strength. Lord, we also ask specifically that she finds a church that will be able to provide transportation to and from their worship services.

11. Please pray for a client who recently found out that she is pregnant and who has made poor health choices. Pray for a healthy pregnancy for this client and health for her growing baby. Lord, please bring about a strong support system who can help this woman on a path to health.
