"Brothers, attached is a pro-life homily on the Sandy Hook Massacre in Newtown, Connecticut. This is a must read for us as we keep the slaughtered children and their families in our daily prayers.

Instead of preaching about the Third Sunday of Advent, the Sunday where we light the rose colored candle signifying the joy of knowing that the Christ Child is coming soon, I am going to do what many priests will do this Sunday: preach about what took place this past Friday at the Sandy Hook School in Newtown, Connecticut.

Now the first thing to keep in mind is the most important: we have to be united with all of those families who have lost children and loved ones. We all have to grieve. Innocent people are now dead. As human beings and as Catholics—since so many of the dead were Catholic—we are all connected, no one ever lives totally alone, so this tragedy is our tragedy as well. This means that we have to show the highest amount of compassion for those who are suffering through what is an extraordinarily horrible tragedy.

But here is what we now have to be painfully aware of: We as a nation, we as Americans are all part of a culture and a society that now produces this sort of behavior with more and more frequency. Just in the past few months we have witnessed in the news the shooting at the movie theater in Aurora, Colorado, the shooting at the mall in Oregon and now, this totally shocking act where it made no difference who was to be killed, even if you were a young child.

There are so many factors, ingredients if you will, in our country today that can cause us to say, since these types of horrific, violent acts are hardly ever seen in other countries, that we are producing more and more children and young adults who are mentally and emotionally broken, and for some of them, because of their mental and emotional instability, we are producing people who are capable of absolute evil.

How did we get to this point? After hearing the news of the school shooting, so many of us I'm sure were tempted to say, "Man, what the hell is going on around here?" And though that type of talk is not normal in a Sunday homily, it is still factual: *hell is going on around here*, all around us.

What are some of the factors, what are some of the things that we can't ignore anymore?

One of the biggest is that we live in a post-Christian age. Let's stop kidding around; we are no longer a Christian nation, despite the fact that about 80% of all American say they believe in God. Only 20% of all Americans even go to church on Sundays. Catholics are a bit better, with about 40% who go to Mass on Sundays.

But there is less and less of the stabilizing effect that religion used to give to so many people. And if religion has less and less of a voice, then what is going to be directly affected? Morality.

Look at any culture throughout the history of the world, even the pagan societies. All of their moral laws were based on how they perceived religion. God drives religion, which drives morality, which influences our laws and how we live; it's all connected.

But God has been abandoned in our country. Part of the reason why is because people have literally become too busy for God, or who have become spiritually bored, or who have adopted the philosophical attitude where the individual, the self, has replaced God. And if there is no God, or very little influence coming down to our communities from God, then there will be no morality.

The horrible attitude that so many people of today subscribe to, "You believe what you want to believe, I'll believe what I want to believe," has horrifying consequences. Because what you believe will directly affect what you do. "You do what you want to do; I'll do what I want to do." But what is left out? What does God want us to do?

And so what becomes set in concrete is the attitude that whatever I want to do is fine because I make up my own world, I make up my own rules, I make up my own version of reality. And what will get lost every single time in this mindset, most of the time on purpose, is sin. There is no sin if you take away the rules. And you take away the rules by taking God out of the picture.

Another ingredient in this mess is that we are totally surrounded by what John Paul II called the "culture of death." Death is all around us: in the news, on the internet, most especially in the video games and of course in a culture that kills its own children with the great sin of abortion.

There is not a single person born in this country under the age of 35 who has known a day when abortion has not been legal. And so what that fact has caused in the minds of so many children is that instead of life being precious and wonderful and beautiful, it is now just a roll of the dice. "Why did I survive, when a brother or a sister, or a cousin of mine did not?" That's a horrible way to live. But consider some other ingredients which contribute to the mess that we are in, and these are given by Msgr. Charles Pope: "We harm our children in so many ways through abortion, fornication and intentional single motherhood/absent fatherhood, divorce, exposing them to pornography and things that harm their innocence, violence, abuse, poor schooling, indoctrination and on and on and on. It is a terrible time to be a child in our culture. If one is not outright killed in the womb, so often they are born into irregular situations and exposed to the endless bad behavior of adults at every level. Increasingly rare are the children who live in anything resembling the loving two-parent mother and father family that they deserve, who provide them a time of innocence to develop virtue and experience the love of God."

One of the biggest problems in our country today, and many of you know this first hand, is that our children are angry. Oh, we are not talking about being a little bit upset, so many children are furious, because children, especially with their ability to wonder and to place their trust in God, look at the world around them—Godless, hopeless, dark, full of death, with a dad who is never around, with a mother who is more caught up in her pain than in her motherhood—and they know that this was not how it was supposed to be! What about those children who survived the shootings in Connecticut? They will never be able to get over that fact: *this was not how it was supposed to be*.

So what can we do? Pope Benedict once said, "In the face of horror ... there is no other answer than the cross of Christ: Love that descends to the abyss of evil."

We need Christ to suffer with us. We need Christ to bring us from our *mourning and weeping in this valley of tears* to bring us to say as Jesus himself said, *The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor*. But how is Christ going to be received in a world that has almost completely rejected God and religion? Now, more than ever in the history of our world, we need saints.

We need men, women and children who are willing to stand up for God and say, "My Lord Jesus, I will be your voice, I will be your hands, I will be your presence in this world." Now that takes a lot of guts, because they crucified Jesus, they will crucify you too. But saints and a whole lot of them are exactly what we need.

### And where are they going to come from? Right here, in front of me.

All of you need to strive to become saints, because what does a saint do? A saint working with God restores hope, faith, and love. And you all can do this by bringing about in everything that you say and do, what is known as the transcendentals of God. God is true. God is good. God is beautiful.

Grieve with the people who lost terribly in this tragedy. But then get out there and accept nothing that is false—absolutely nothing. God is true; Jesus himself said that he is the Truth. Only deal then with what is true. And if you don't know what is true and what is false, then it's time to stop playing around and it's time to start reading the Bible, the Catechism and the lives of the saints.

God is good. So do nothing, think nothing that is also not purely good. Keep your minds and your hearts pure. Don't dwell on anything evil; don't even think about anything evil. Stay completely surrounded by a God who is Goodness itself.

And, no more ugliness. God is beautiful. And He gives us beautiful things, the greatest of which is life. So accept nothing that takes away beauty. Reject all that is ugly, hideous or revolting. Let us all bring beauty back into this world.

And finally, you parents love your children as God loves them, as He loves you as a matter of fact: completely, unconditionally. And you children, honor your parents, and begin to dream once again. Begin to dream as the Baby Jesus dreamt when he was held in the arms of his mother Mary. The world that he was born into was dark and dangerous and ugly, just like ours is. But Jesus, the Christ Child dreamt of making all things new. He now needs his saints to help him do just that."



# AARP TAX Aide

Knights and Lady Knights

Again, AARP Tax-Aide is looking for volunteers that are good with numbers

but don't need to know how to do income taxes, as we teach you. Your help would provide free tax services to seniors and the less fortunate in downtown Denver. Every year, many seniors and low-income families have to pay for tax preparation. Sadly, their refund goes to the tax preparer. Our service is free!

Our group is called AARP Tax-Aide, a not-for-profit arm of the AARP Foundation. AARP Tax-Aide is the nation's largest, free, volunteer-run tax assistance service. For over 40 years, AARP, in conjunction with the IRS, has provided this tax service for low to middle-income families and taxpayers 60 and older. Jointly, AARP and the IRS, provide all the necessary training, training materials, supplies, and computers

There currently are not enough tax preparers or greeters. Many days, we must turn people away because we can only complete a limited number of returns. AARP needs your help to prepare and file their taxes.

AARP also needs volunteers to greet the clients that come into our tax sites. 9:00 PM Mass on Christmas Eve. To be a greeter, these volunteers should be comfortable around people and have good organizational abilities.

Tax preparers become certified after taking 3 days of classroom training and passing the IRS exam in January. Greeters only need to take 2 hour training on one day in January. The actual tax preparation is done February 1st until April 17th, at the downtown Denver site, Monday through Friday from 10:00 AM until 3:00 PM. Volunteers can work from 1 to 5 days a week during the tax season.

We are very blessed. Please pay it forward and help the less fortunate with your God given abilities. Call or email me at the contact information

# **Statistics from 40 Days For** Life fall 2012 campaign:

- 821 babies were saved from abortions.
- 6 abortion workers quit their jobs.

- 1 Planned Parenthood Center closed its doors 5 days after the campaign ended.
- Since the first 40 Days For Life Campaign:
- There have been 2,210 campaigns in 481 cities.
- There have been 550,000 participants who have joined together to pray and fast.
- 15,500 Church congregations have participated.
- 6.749 lives have been saved from abortion.
- 75 abortion workers have quit their jobs.
- 25 abortion centers have closed

The next 40 Days For Life campaign is from Feb. 13<sup>th</sup>, 2013 to March 24<sup>th</sup>, 2013.

# **Parenthood Dec 15:**

We started with a prayer led by Mnsgr Schmidt around 0915 followed by a procession around the block on which the Aurora Planned Parenthood is situated. The Procession was led by the District Master Buljung. Following him was an image of Our Lady of Guadeloupe rolled on a dolly by a Franciscan brother. It was a special image: an exact digital reproduction of the image hanging in the Cathedral in Mexico City in color and size. The image was flanked by two more Knights. We prayed the rosary as we went.

After once around the block, the procession entered the vacant lot across from the Planned Parenthood and Mnsgr Schmidt concluded with a litany and a closing blessing around 10 AM.



There were about 80 people in the procession, praying earnestly for the lives of the babies at risk as the cars bearing young women turned into this facility of evil. Others on ladders called out as the individuals went up the steps, others tried to hand out literature to the cars as they turned into the entrance of this death factory.



Sir Knights: this is the front line of the cultural wars. As Patriotic Fourth Degree members, it is our duty to stand up for life and for the defense of our Judeo-Christian values. The call went out to every Assembly on the Denver and Colorado Springs Dioceses! What a tragedy that of all the thousands of Knights who received the call, **only three of us showed up**! I call on every Sir Knight to examine his conscience and ask "what else was I doing that Saturday morning that was more important than

the fight for the lives of these little innocents?"

### **Broken Women**



I was 18 and dating a man my parents strongly disapproved of. When I told my parents I was pregnant, they told me they would kick me out if I didn't have an abortion. Everyone told me that abortion was the best route for me.

The abortion did not "solve all my problems", llas everyone had promised. My parents still kicked me out - I had to quit school and I married the boyfriend He was an alcoholic and a drug addict. He beat me up and brought other women into our bed.

He held a knife to my chest one night during a drunken spree. I told him to kill me, that I wanted to die. I had nothing. No parents, no husband, really, no baby, and no self-respect. I had killed our child I was a murderer. I truly wanted to die.

Soon after this we were separated and divorced. The abortion left a scene of destruction. My family, my first marriage, my image of myselfall a total wreck. Nothing will ever be the same. God is merciful. I didn't know Him then like I do now. I've had one child since then, and I'm pregnant again. These children are my joy and my forgiveness from God If I had only known how sweet and wonderful a baby is, I never would have had the abortion - not in two million years.

### Alternatives Pregnancy Center – Prayer Requests – December 18, 2012

1. Please pray for a client and her partner as they consider having an abortion. Please pray that they will become open to discussing their lifegiving options with one another and that they would be encouraged through a strong support system.

2. Please pray for a pregnant client who is considering having an abortion. Pray that the hesitation she is feeling in her heart will be stronger than the pressure to choose this option. Lord, please intervene in her life and show her as well as her family how she can choose one of her lifegiving options.

3. Please pray for a client who is experiencing tough circumstances and who is thinking that having an abortion is her only option. Pray for physical healing of her body and also pray that she recognizes the life giving option that will fit into her future plans.

4. Praise the Lord for several clients that have changed their minds about having an abortion and have decided to parent their children. Thank you, Lord, that they have chosen life!

5. Praise the Lord that a pregnant client is choosing to place her child for adoption. Please pray that she can remain strong in her choice as she is experiencing some negative feedback because of her decision. Pray that the Lord would grant her peace through the hearts and eyes of her support system so they can become an encouragement to her for this lifegiving choice!

6. Please pray for a client as she seeks answers to her medical concerns. Pray that she is empowered to become her own advocate and that she becomes knowledgeable about what questions to ask. Lord, please grant her peace during this time of uncertainty and bring her answers that she can accept.

7. Please pray for a client who is facing her pregnancy without her partner - the father of her baby. Pray that she can remain strong and that she is surrounded by supportive people so she is not alone.

8. Praise the Lord that a client has a desire to abstain from sex until she is married. Pray that she and her boyfriend remain strong and encouraging to one another as they live out this commitment.

9. Please pray for a client who is struggling to leave an abusive relationship. Pray that she is able to see a hopeful future for herself and her Chubbick baby.

10. Praise the Lord for a client who changed her mind about having an abortion and has delivered a healthy baby! We also praise God that the father of the baby has chosen to stay and that together this couple can raise their child together. Thank you, Lord, for these lives.

11. Please pray for a client who is feeling overwhelmed at the news that she is pregnant. Pray for this woman to have the strength to ask for help and also for her to experience financial relief so that she can feel confident in herself and in a lifegiving decision for her pregnancy.

12. Please pray for a client whose her pregnancy and that He would open heart is telling her to parent; however, due to outside pressures, she is feeling conflicted about this choice.
