Joshua Elmo Tracy, or Josh, was born in Anaconda, Montana on April 5th, 1975 and grew up in Billings.

Josh went to Skyview High School in Billings, MT, Carroll College in Helena, Montana, and the University of Phoenix. He held a BA in Accounting and Business Administration with an emphasis in Finance Management, an Economics Business Degree and an MBA in Technology Management.


While growing up Josh liked anything to do with sports.

Josh worked for Standard and Poor's Compustat in 1998 and 1999, then Merrill Lynch from 1999 through 2005 and most recently was the Senior Staff Accountant for Isle Corporation.

Josh became a Knight in June of 2011 and just recently received his 4th Degree. You saw Josh at our Fish Fries, Spaghetti Dinners, Pancake Breakfasts, the Peach Sale and Denver Rescue Mission. Josh was also our Financial Secretary, taking over this position in July.

When Josh wasn't doing his Staff Account thing for the Isle Corporation, he motivated high school football players as a coach at Chaparral High School.

Josh was diagnosed with stage 2 brain cancer in February of 2011 and completed his treatment in April of that same year.

Josh was a committed participant and provider of faith formation at Pax Christi for the past five years. His presence, his friendly personality, his happy disposition, and the God-given gifts he shared will be greatly missed.

Josh was a sponsor in RCIA for Marc Zarlengo in 2009-2010 and served as a sponsor for Tim Morgan in 2012-2013. Josh also was an RCIA Team member from 2010-2013. As such, Josh came to every session and ministered as a catechist and small group facilitator. He also provided the hospitality of a parishioner who loved people, and had a great sense of humor! Josh also was present for every RCIA Rite (at least 6 per year) and assisted with a Friday night –Saturday night yearly retreat. As a team member, Josh came to monthly team meetings, training sessions, and attended a three-day Institute for RCIA team members provided by the *North American Forum on the Catechumenate*.

Josh became a catechist for Generations of Faith in 2011. In 2011-2012, Josh was a catechist for 6 graders for two different groups, during the 2 Sunday afternoon session and the Monday evening session. In 2012-2013, Josh ministered as a catechist for Senior High young people during the

1st Sunday afternoon session and during the 2th Sunday afternoon session, Josh ministered as a catechist for Junior High young people. As a catechist, Josh participated in three 2-hour Catechist Training sessions prior to catechizing, and participated in seven monthly 2-hour formation sessions in theology and methodology for the two years he ministered as a catechist.

I always looked to Josh as a model Knight dedicating his life to charity, unity, fraternity and paternity. Below are some examples: He was a catechist for Generations of Faith and on the RCIA team. I taught GOF with Josh for the last couple of years. Josh would teach 2-3 classes for each month's session. Most people complain about teaching one. He went over and above the call of duty to ensure that the 5-6th graders and 7-8th graders or the high schoolers always had a catechist. I admired him for his sacrifice and commitment. He didn't have to help, but he always did....CHARITY

I am not sure how many years Josh was involved in RCIA but it was a bunch. Again, Josh would give freely of his time and talent to catechize the candidates. He went through the 9-10 month process each year and rarely missed a session. He was the sponsor for many new candidates and an authentic example of a good catholic man.

Josh worked with local area high school sports teams (Machbeuf and Chaparral) coaching and assisting young athletes with football, basketball and baseball games, tournaments and practices. He would drive all over the Denver metro area helping these schools. Again, he was an inspiration to me because he set the bar for helping others....CHARITY.

Josh was a frequent helper for many of the KoC events and always a smiling face to greet you. I remember working with Josh plowing snow, making breakfast, during the fish fries, spaghetti dinners and reconciliation dinners for visiting priests. Josh was the new Knights of Columbus' financial secretary. He helped out with many other events; those are the ones that I attended. I always loved talking with him about how busy he was and what activities he was doing at the time. He was always upbeat and it gave me the fuel to want to do the same....UNITY and FRATERNITY.
