October is Respect Life Month

October is Respect Life Month when we make an extra effort to spread the pro-life message. In most cases, it is a single event at a parish, a Life Chain, a banquet, conference, baby bottle drive, 40 Days for Life etc. We commend these efforts but what happens once these events are over? In most cases, **its dead silence until next year!**

Fr. Stephen Imbarrato states that "we are all complicit, every one of us in the sin of abortion. Yesterday 3,300 babies died, today 3,300 babies will die and tomorrow 3,300 babies will die. What did you do about those babies? We need to wake up every day and ask, not what can I do, but what more can I do?" Blessed John Paul II and Pope Benedict XVI said that there is "no greater work to be done than to defend human life and woe to us if we fail".

Is it right to make an extra effort during one month while turning our backs for eleven long months on the little boys and girls who cannot defend themselves? How do you suppose God

must feel? How bizarre that animals, plants and mammals have more rights than baby humans. Anyone caught brutalizing an animal the way a child is brutalized would certainly do jail time.

How can we plead ignorance, when abortion has been the law of the land for almost 40 years? How can we plead ignorance when we are living in the age of information? How can we plead ignorance when abortion has been the most controversial and divisive issue even before Roe V. Wade. How can we plead ignorance when we stand before an all-knowing and all-seeing God? Better we get this right on this side of Heaven, rather than having to fess-up for our sins of omission!

"Human life is sacred and inviolable at every moment of existence, including the initial phase which precedes birth. All human beings, from their mother's womb, belong to God who searches them and knows them, who forms them and knits them together with his own hands, who gazes on them when they are tiny shapeless embryos and already sees in them the adults of tomorrow whose days are numbered and whose vocation is even now written in the 'book of life.' There too, when they are still in their mothers' womb—as many passages of the Bible bear witness—they are the personal objects of God's loving and fatherly providence." (Evangelium Vitae, 61).

When Blessed John Paul II shared these words with us they were powerful, and they still are. The term Pro-Life is faithfully used among Catholics and is commonly used in the defense and protection of the unborn. The Knights of Columbus supports policies that promote a Culture of Life and opposes legislative efforts that promote abortion, contraception, sterilization, cloning, the destruction of embryos, assisted suicide, euthanasia, unjust war, and the death penalty when there is an acceptable alternative.

Culture of Life and Right to Life are terms also commonly used. Culture of Life is what so actively drives many of our Council events. Our daily devotionals sent directly to your email in the "40 days for life" campaign ask us to reflect and pray for young mothers and their unborn to preserve their lives. "40 cans for Lent" produced hundreds of pounds of food for those in needs last year. The current Tootsie Roll Campaign will produce funds for the mentally handicapped. Our Thanksgiving Basket drive provides full Thanksgiving meals to those who might not otherwise be able to celebrate this day of thanks.

Helping those in need and helping seniors is such an integral part of this. One might even suggest that those of you who studied to perform income tax preparation services for seniors is a support of Culture of Life event. And of course by now you have seen the white crosses in front of the church signifying the 54 million lives lost since Roe vs Wade went into effect.

Right to life is something we so graciously enjoy in Colorado. The 4th Degree celebrates the bravery of our soldiers and gives us the opportunity to celebrate our freedoms while at the same time, thanking them.

Enjoy and appreciate your health, family, marriage and religion and along the way, remember to "JUST ASK".

October is Respect Life month. It is a whole month where we think about, pray about and perform actions to primarily support Pro-Life activities. There is a lot going on this month.

First of all there is the 40 Days for Life program which has already started. This program consists of praying, reading and thinking on a daily meditation. You may find these daily meditations at http://www.40daysforlife.com/getinvolved.html. I encourage every Knight and their families to participate in this dynamic program.

Every Saturday Mass is held on a Colorado Springs street corner near the Planned Parenthood facility. This weekly event takes place on Centennial Avenue at 8:00AM. Mass is normally attended by about 100 people. If you never attended Mass on a street corner, this will be a totally different experience.

On October 25th the annual Bishops Respect Life banquet will be held at the Broadmoor Hotel in Colorado Springs. The cost is \$40 per person. Mike and Denise McGinnis and Herb and Vonnie Engler attended last year and they report a most moving and memorable experience.

On Sunday, October 13th, The Alternatives Pregnancy Center will have their bus with the Ultra Sound Machine parked in the Pax Christi parking lot. Every Knight and their families should visit the bus to learn more about their Ultra Sound services and why it is an important tool to help a woman chose life for her baby.

And speaking of the Alternatives Pregnancy Center, every month we place a link in this newsletter with prayers and petitions for their clients – clients who are struggling with the

thought of abortion. Do you pay attention to this link? Please pray for those women (and Men) struggling with this most important decision.

And finally, please consider October to be a beginning of your concern and commitment to support the Respect Life movement. This is one of the most important initiatives of the Knight of Columbus. If we forget about it for another year, are we truly on the right side of heaven.

Don't forget to attend our next business meeting on Saturday, October 12th in room 1. Mass is at 07:30 AM and the meeting starts at 8:00 AM

We still need a new Financial Secretary. Please consider applying for this position. Here are the requirements:

GENERAL INFORMATION

- Must be a member of the Third Degree.
- Must be at least 2 I years of age.
- May not be engaged in the sale of life or health insurance for another organization.
- Shall not hold another elected position within the council.
- Will *hold* a three year term subject to evaluation at the end of the term.
- May not have a criminal record.

ACCOUNTING

- Upon appointment shall be bonded for \$5000.00. Additional bonding may be obtained at a cost of \$7.00 per thousand.
- Shall receive compensation from Supreme Council at \$.40 per each insurance certificate registered with the council. Shall receive compensation from council with amount to be determined by the council.
- Collects and receives all monies.
- Pays over monies to treasurer received at or between meetings.
- Adheres to Supreme Council rules in accounting for monies and recording membership additions and changes.
- Draws orders on treasurer. Such orders shall be signed by financial secretary and countersigned by the grand knight. Keeps an account of indebtedness of each member.
- Keeps records of financial and business transactions upon books or software approved by Board of Directors.
- Files #990 Return of Organization Exempt from Income Tax Form.

MEMBERSHIP

- Processes membership bills.
- Keeps roll of members.
- Causes members to subscribe to By-laws.

- Notifies Supreme Secretary of elections.
- Notifies Supreme Secretary of membership transactions.
- Shall keep the seal of the council.
- Performs other acts required by the laws of his council and the Order and the rules of the Board of Directors.
- Complies with all confidentiality and data management requirements of Supreme Council.

Guidelines for Political Activity (2nd Printing)

Since this occasionally surfaces as a hot topic of discussion, we decided to include this entire article in the newsletter. From the:



Knights are first and foremost Catholic citizens who are members of their communities and constituents of their elected officials. A citizen most effectively petitions his elected official as an individual voter. Ordinarily, there is no need to refer to one's membership in the Knights of Columbus when petitioning an elected official. The message we want to send is "I am an informed constituent who has a principled stand [against / in favor of] your public policy choices and I vote." As Pope Benedict XVI has reminded us: "It is imperative that the entire Catholic community in the United States comes to realize the grave threats to the Church's public moral witness."[1] To help members answer this call to faithful citizenship effectively, the Knights of Columbus provides the following list of political activity "DOs and DON'Ts":

DOs

- DO become active in the political life of your local community;
- DO register to vote and encourage others to register to vote;
- DO initiate and participate in robust "get out the vote" efforts to bring voters to the polls in all primary, general, and special elections;
- DO become informed on public policy issues of fundamental interest to the Catholic Church at the local, state, federal, and international levels;
- DO become acquainted with public policy initiatives of the national conferences of Catholic Bishops as well as state and provincial Catholic conferences;
- DO study and reflect upon the teachings of the Catholic Church so as to develop a well-formed Catholic conscience a good place to start would be to review relevant sections of the Catechism of the Catholic Church, available at http://www.vatican.va/archive/ENG0015/_INDEX.HTM;

- DO order booklets on specific issues of fundamental importance to Catholics published by the Catholic Information Service, http://www.kofc.org/un/en/cis/index.html;
- DO share with others the Catholic Church's teachings on moral issues of fundamental importance to society;
- DO advocate for Catholic positions on local and national legislative and other issues of fundamental interest to the Catholic Church. This includes participation in action alert announcements that seek to make the voices of Catholic citizens heard on legislation of fundamental interest to the Catholic Church;
- DO write letters to the editor of local newspapers;
- DO know your elected representatives and their positions on issues of fundamental interest to the Catholic Church;
- DO correspond with your representatives and let them know that you support the Catholic position on issues of fundamental interest to the Catholic Church;
- DO thank representatives for their actions taken on issues of fundamental interest to the Catholic Church;
- DO join the Supreme Council and your State Council in advocating for public policy issues. When doing so, echo the sentiments and wording the Supreme Council or your State Council have already articulated; and
- DO VOTE!

DON'Ts

- DO NOT engage in any partisan political activity in the name of the Knights of Columbus. Partisan political activity is defined as including activity that seeks to endorse or oppose a candidate or party in a campaign for public office.
- DO NOT make partisan political statements in the name of the Knights of Columbus. A partisan political statement is defined as including statements that seek to endorse or oppose a candidate or party in a campaign for public office.
- DO NOT, on behalf of your local council, congratulate or admonish public officials in the name of the Knights of Columbus.
- DO NOT, on behalf of your local council, take a position on a matter of public policy unless you are joining a position the Supreme Council or your State Council has already articulated;
- DO NOT distribute any Knights of Columbus member lists or contact information to political campaigns or to individuals running for office;
- DO NOT use an official fraternal title in connection with your personal political activity, except to convey biographical information; and
- DO NOT use Knights of Columbus facilities, including, but not limited to, email accounts, social media, fax machines, letterhead and the like, in connection with partisan political activity.

Father Colby's Absolution; A New Brotherhood of Battle via a Shared Moment of Faith

Taken from an article by William Burton Kurtz, which appeared in I-5 Publishing 2013 Commemorative Issue; "Gettysburg: 150th Anniversary"

With the shelling of Fort Sumter in April 1861, Civil War came to America. Across the Northern United States, ethnic Catholics, and in particular Irish Catholics, answered the call. While many Catholic priests served as chaplains in the Union Army during the war, one historical notable was a Father William Corby.

At the start of hostilities Father Corby was a member of the Congregation of the Holy Cross at Notre Dame, South Bend Indiana. Upon entering the chaplaincy corps, Father

Corby was assigned to the famous Irish Brigade of the 88th New York Infantry Regiment.

As causalities mounted, Father Corby and his fellow Catholic chaplains made concerted efforts to serve the spiritual needs of the Catholic Union soldiers both in individual units and hospitals. Nevertheless, Corby was catapulted to historical prominence at the Battle of Gettysburg, which took place from the 1st to the 3rd of July 1863. On the second day of the battle, the Irish Brigade was ordered to take a position in the center of the Union line. Just before moving into position, Father Corby asked the unit to halt so he could administer general absolution to the men of the brigade. This selfless demonstrative act of faith was so moving that even the Protestant solders took part. "The Absolution," as it is now known, would become one of the most historically famous and religious inspiring moments of the Civil War.

In 1864, the bishop ordered Father Corby back to Notre Dame where he would serve twice as president. And through the years, until his death in 1897, Father Corby was very active in Civil War veteran affairs. In 1910, friends and supporters of Father Corby's memory had a statue erected in his honor on the Gettysburg battlefield. It depicts him standing on a rock doing what he knew how to do best, which was tending to the spiritual needs of his fellow man.

Colorado Knights of Columbus Ultrasound Program September 2013

The Knights of Columbus Charities Fund in Colorado (a 501(c)3 charitable organization) has been funding the purchase of ultrasound machines used in pregnancy crisis centers in Colorado in an attempt to convince pregnant women not to abort their babies. Currently, eight ultrasound machines have been purchased by the K of C in Colorado and are located in the following cities: Aurora, Pueblo, Colorado Springs, LaJunta, Denver, Steamboat Spring, Lafayette / Boulder, and Greeley. These machines are placed in centers which promote pro-life. Five of these ultrasound machines are located in permanent pregnancy crisis centers located in very close proximity to abortion centers, such as the Planned Parenthood Center in Denver. A sixth ultrasound machine has been placed in a mobile van in Colorado Springs and is moved between multiple abortion centers. The seventh machine is used in multiple centers in the Boulder and Lafayette communities. The last machine -- and one of the most expensive -- was recently placed in Greeley. It is a 3D/4D high-end fixed placed machine that cost \$46,000.

A pregnancy crisis center in Westcliffe is currently pursuing state approval to operate there. K of C Charities in Colorado is raising funds for this ultrasound machine.

Depending upon the type of ultrasound purchased – fixed placement, portable, or one for a mobile van – the cost ranges from \$12,500 to 50,000 with a fixed placement machine being the largest and most expensive.

The success of this ultrasound initiative has been INCREDIBLE. For all the women that have consented to be tested using these ultrasound machines, 80 - 90% of these women have decided NOT to pursue abortion. For all those who have supported this ultrasound initiative, you should feel very proud of these results.






