



Help is needed contacting local breweries for the beer garden at the Church block party.


f. Right to Life report - Mike McGinnis





Each year, right around the annual March for Life, the Knights of Columbus releases the results of a poll on abortion conducted for the KOC by the highly respected The Marist Institute for Public Opinion. The KOC asks slightly different questions which help the average citizen get a feel for where the American public is on dimensions of the abortion issue that aren't often probed.

Satisfaction With U.S. Abortion Policies

Next, we'd like to know how you feel about the state of the nation in each of the following areas. For each one, please say whether you are -- very satisfied, somewhat satisfied, somewhat dissatisfied, or very dissatisfied. How about the nation's policies regarding the abortion issue?






The latest survey, commissioned the second week in January, included 2,079 U.S. adults aged 18 and older. Because the survey is huge, the margin of error is small: +/- 2 percentage points.

What do we learn? Here are seven primary results.

#1. A total of 59% believe that abortion should be available only in cases of rape, incest, or to save the life of mother (32%); only to save the life of the mother (14%); or not permitted under any circumstances (13%). If you add only available during the first three months (25%), the total becomes 84%. #2. 64% believe there are too many abortions; 7% believe there are too few.

#3. 60% think abortion is morally wrong, while only 38% think it is morally acceptable.

#4. A pair of questions Marist asks each year for the KOC which are always intriguing. A whopping majority does not believe in the either/or perspective: 84% says laws can protect both the well-being of a woman and the life of her unborn child. Moreover 59% view abortion as doing more harm to women than believes abortion does women good (22%).

#5. What about parental notification before a minor can obtain an abortion? 78% approve.

#6. Taxpayer funding of abortion? 68% oppose, 28% approve.
#7. And by a margin of 20 points (57% to 37%) "Americans support proposed legislation that would permit medical professionals and organizations to refuse to provide abortions or refer patients for abortions."

Ben spoke about Father Maximilion Kolbe, who, after volunteering to take the place of one of the ten prisoners in the Nazi concentration camp Auschwitz, was condemned to die of starvation in retaliation for the escape of three prisoners. He was finally killed by the Nazis with a lethal injection of carbonic acid after he outlasted the other nine prisoners who starved to death. He had been imprisoned in Auschwitz concentration camp for helping hide Jews and publishing anti-Nazi materials. He was recognized as a Christian Martyr and canonized in 1982 by Pope John Paul II.



The Supreme Council began the Christian Refugee Relief Fund in August 2014 and has since raised \$3.6 million through donations from individuals, Knights, councils, and assemblies, and the Order's matching donation of \$1.1 million.

To date, \$200,000 from this fund has been donated in general aid to the Greek Melkite Catholic Archdiocese of Aleppo, Syria and \$2 million to build houses in the Diocese of Erbil, Iraq to shelter Christian refugees who were driven from their homes.
