XI. Lecturer - Alan Brown/Ben Stancati

The Rev. Robert F. Houlihan S.J. Educator Series

Alan Brown led the discussion, the topic for the meeting centered on the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, the patron saint of the Colorado Springs Diocese. The story begins in 1521, with the Spanish conquest of Mexico that in time resulted in the complete an utter destruction of the Mexican Aztec culture and civilization. Along with conquest the Spanish also brought their Catholic Christian religion, thus forcing many Aztecs to choose either baptism or death. The Aztec natives for centuries had worshiped ancient gods of the moon and the sun, and one goddess called the "Great Mother." Being dark skinned they strongly resisted the idea of giving up their gods to worship a God-made-flesh, one who had pale skin.

Ten years later on 9 December 1531, a poor native Indian peasant by the name of Juan Diego was walking to mass along a country trail near what today is Mexico City. Suddenly a voice called out to him, and there appeared the Blessed Mary. She wore the garb of the native people and had the physical features, dark skin and eyes, of the Aztecs. According to Juan Diego, Mary stood on top of a burnt-out crescent moon, and in front of the sun blocking its view. Her demeanor was not that of a goddess, but one of humility with her head extended downward in a devout pose. Her clothing, however, was reminiscent of that reserved for Aztec royalty, brightly colored blue-greens tinted with rose. She wore a black sash, an Aztec symbol of a woman who had given birth to a child.

Mary spoke to Juan Diego in his native language, requesting that he tell the Bishop-of-Mexico that her name was Santa Maria Coatallope and that she wished to have a chapel built on that mountain site. Juan did as instructed, yet failed in his efforts to convince the bishop of the authenticity of the visitation and the need to honor Mary's request. Finally on her third appearance Mary instructed Juan Diego to take some roses, highly unusual for December, as a sign for the bishop. Juan wrapped some of the roses in his cloak. When he spilled the roses out in front of the bishop, an image of the Blessed Mary was on the garment.

In the context of the brutal treatment of the Indians by the Spanish, the apparition was stern rebuke of their behavior. While few Indians converted prior to the appearance of Mary, they did so in droves after. Within six years, six million Mexicans, nearly the total population had converted to Catholicism. Today the Archdiocese of Mexico City is the world's largest Catholic archdiocese with approximately seven million Catholics. It has about 150,000 baptisms a year, which is more than the entire Catholic population of many dioceses across the globe. In reflection, the appearance of Mary to Juan Diego as one of his own is a powerful reminder of both God's and Mary's love for all peoples.
