<u>II. Chaplain's Reflection</u> - Father Marek



Alan gave a glimpse of the "Be a Man Series, written by Father Larry Richards. The Pax Christi Point Men reviewed the 10 chapters of Father Larry's book over 2 semesters in the Fall and Spring this year. The Pax Christi Point Men group is a men's fellowship program that is geared towards fellowship and faith formation. Father Larry's Book covers 10 chapters including "Be a Man Series" stays focused on the final goal, who lives as a beloved son, who repents, who lives in the holy spirit, who is strong, who is loving, who is wise, who lives as he was created and who is holy and who changes the world."

As part of the discussion Alan covered the 9th session, "Be a Man who is Holy" by letting the group know some of the topics discussed in the DVD. In this chapter, men learn that being holy "means striving for holiness, to be continually grasping the circumstances we call "moments" and using them to change and grow, and allowing God to transform us into all he created us to be." In Rediscovering Catholicism, Matthew Kelly, via Catechism 2708, makes the point that "In making man in his image and likeness, God "crowned him with glory and honor," yet by sinning, man fell "short of the glory of God."

Holiness is a byproduct of love, yet it means to be set apart from other spiritual virtues, e.g. God chose us to be holy before man was created. Father Larry argues that "I am holy because God chose me and Jesus lives in me." True holiness, therefore, is a byproduct of love. In Matthew 5:6, it says that "Blessed are those who hunger and search for righteousness for they shall be filled." Father Larry believes that the greatest obstacle to holiness is pride and that there is no holiness without a love for the cross and Jesus. Turning once again to Catechism 2708, it suggests that the pathway to holiness involves a number of spiritual exercises, such as meditation in Lectio Divina (study scripture and listening for God's word); reciting the Rosary; deepening our convictions of faith; prompting conversation of the heart, and strengthening our will to follow Christ. Additionally, one should ask God each day via prayer, what His will is for us today.
