III. Grand Knight Report - Gary Mayfield

IV. Chaplain's Report – Father Marek

• For this month's meeting Father Marek's discussion centered on the mass and the Eucharist, specifically the apparent lack of knowledge on what the spiritual and religious focus, and purpose is of each. This issue came to light in working with the children going through preparations for their First Holy Communion. To his amazement, Father Marek found that the parents seemed to be less prepared then the children. Therefore, Father Marek has decided to embark on an education program concerning the mass and the Eucharist in order to enhance everyone's understanding of what the purpose and focus is of each and why we come to mass in the first place. In addition, the initiative will also address how each of us should approach the mass from a spiritual, mental, emotional, and physical perspective. And as members of a Catholic Community, how each of us should participate in the celebration of the mass. Father stressed that this initiative will not be a one-time event, yet will extend over a number of months. He plans on starting with the members of our council, and then expanding it out to the rest of the parish. Lastly, Father Marek once again reminded all of what the historical, Biblical, and traditional roles and responsibilities are of the male in the family, which is to lead the family in its spiritual growth and development.

b. <u>Church Director Report</u> – **Dermot O'Doherty** (given by Bill Hensen)

- Sunday donuts are ongoing per the schedule.

c. Community Report – Bob Luckner/Ford Fay/Dan Doran (given by Bill Hensen)

- 40 Cans-For-Lent is completed, with the food delivery date held as planned on April 8.
 - Donated canned food plus \$2000 dollars-worth of donated food stuffs went to the Denver Rescue Mission, with \$1000 going to the St. Elizabeth food pantry.
- Highway Cleanup is scheduled for May 20. Paul Sciera has for action, more to follow.

d. Council Activity Report – Nereus Lobo/Paul Sciera (given by Bill Hensen)

- Breakfast Burritos (from the planning meeting).
 - The last one was on April 30, with roughly \$657 in sales with \$260 in expenses (\$215 in burrito expenses and \$45 in Sam's Club membership renewal).
 - Due to a number of events scheduled for May there will be no burritos for that, the next one is tentatively scheduled for June 25.
 - Brennan Mendus will be taking the summer months off from doing burritos. Therefore, Gary Mayfield is soliciting for someone to take over running this event just during the months of June and July.
- The Denver Rescue Mission outreach event was held on May 6.
- Council/family monthly socials:
 - For May, spaghetti dinner on the 13th plus the Memorial Day Weekend party, May 27, at the Kennedy's.
 - For June, it will be at the Mayfield's house on the 16th starting at 6:30PM.
 - For July, it is the 25th Council Anniversary Party on the 22nd.

- For August, it will be the Parish Block Party on the 19th.
- The council 25th Anniversary Dinner is to be held on July 22nd after the 5PM mass. Part of the proceeds raised, approximately 1K, will go the Youth Group in support of next year's mission trip.
- The annual Peach Drive is slated to begin in July, with pickup from the grower on Aug 11, delivery to buyers on Aug 12.
- Due to increased job responsibilities, Nereus is looking for a replacement.

e. Family Report - Tony Mancuso

- The next spaghetti dinner is scheduled for May 13, Mother's Day Weekend.

f. Right to Life Report – Mike McGinnis

- Events/activities:
 - The 2017 '40 Days for Life' 2017 devotional campaign, which ended on April 10, has been billed a major success, see attachment page 13 for the statistics.
 - The 'Life Network" initiative, see attachment page 14 for an explanation of how this effort supports the pro-life movement in our communities.
 - Catholic Charities' is offering free prenatal nurturing classes (see attachment pg.15).
 - The parish Right to Life Committee has been formed. Currently the committee is composed of 11 members, more to follow as Father Bierbaum becomes more engaged.
 - In honor of Mother's Day weekend, the council is planning to distribute flower seed packets after all masses (see attachment pg. 16). This will require 4 Knights for each mass, 2 at the back door and 2 in front.

• Ongoing:

- The 'Rose for Motherhood' program after all Baptisms.
- All are encouraged to consider praying in front of the Planned Parenthood building. When this happens their no-show rate goes up to 75%, so our prayers are having an effect.

g. **Youth Report** – **Alan Brown/Ben Stancati** (given by Ben Stancati)

- The council's KofC Stewardship College Scholarship award contest.
 - o Was completed on April 8 after the monthly business meeting
 - o Cassie Rae Alvarado is the declared winner.
 - o 6 applications were received and reviewed.
 - Reviewers, six total, included Mike McGinnis, Ben Stancati, Wilbur Tan, Tim Pimmel, Dennis Thuman and Alan Brown
 - Each application was reviewed and graded by the review team.
 - o Thank you notes were sent to each of the 6 participants along with a \$20 Chipoltle gift certificate.
 - Sometime in in June July time frame the plan is to give Cassie Rae her first check, which
 can then be applied towards any incurred loans and tuition costs that may come due in
 July/August.
- Remodeling and renovation of the youth room:
 - Sketch of the proposed room is upstairs in the narthex.
 - Concerning demolition and construction, the guidelines from Father Krol is that council
 members can do the demo work, yet all construction work will be done by a bonded general
 contractor, which is a diocesan requirement.

- o Father Marek asked Alan to come by and see him about the youth room, more information to follow concerning the actual demolition date.
- Chenele has informed Alan that they now have plenty of parents participating for both Edge and Lifeteen, and, therefore, previously requested assistance from Knights is no longer needed.
 - o Ben Stancati has gone the last two times and she is thankful for his participation.
 - o If anyone else would like to attend there are two more sessions, 5/14 and 5/28.
- There is a fun day at Skyzone scheduled for Saturday, 5/27, 11-2pm with Chenele and the youth group.
- Alan is working with Chenele about having some kids from the Youth Group help with the KofC Council 25th Anniversary party on July 22, more to follow.
- Ongoing council members are encouraged to attend the parish's Safe Environment Training classes, either the initial or refresher as appropriate. The next sessions are scheduled for May 22nd starting at 5:30PM.

XVI. Good of the Order

• Lecturer – Alan Brown/Ben Stancati (given by Ben Stancati)
For the month of May the discussion concerns the 100th Anniversary of Fatima, May 13, 1917. Due to work commitments Alan was not available so the topic was introduced by Ben Stancati.

Alan planned on discussing something that he had learned last year with the Point Men as they engaged in the Divine Mercy series by Father Michael Gaitley. Father Gaitley connected the third message/revelation, which described soldiers shooting guns and arrows at a bishop in white, with the plea of the Blessed Mary to the children for all to pray the rosary daily in order to change the course of world events. The two at the time were WWI and the Russian Revolution. The people of the world listened to this call and started reciting the Holy Rosary daily. Father Gaitley proposed that this action actually helped changed the course of world history. WWI did come to close (yet unresolved issues unfortunately set the stage for WWII, also foretold by Mary). In time, Communist Russia did collapse. And finally, St Pope John Paul II, a bishop in white, survived an assassination attempt. The bullet missed his artery by millimeters, because as the pope would later proclaim, "the Holy Spirit guided the bullet with the hand of God". It seems that the prayers and rosaries of the people of the world have helped to change the trajectory of world history, along with helping to save the life of a beloved pope.

Below is a brief explanation of the pro-life services that Life Network provides to our community:

Life Network offers free life affirming services to more than 15,000 women, men and children in the Colorado Springs community each year. These free services include pregnancy tests, pregnancy options counseling, ultrasounds, STD testing and treatment, baby clothing and furnishings, parenting education, childbirth and infant care classes, emergency baby supplies, maternity clothing, post abortion recovery groups, and education to local high schools on sexual risk-avoidance (chastity option). During 2016, the Colorado Springs Pregnancy Center served more than 7,000 clients, and 455 ultrasounds were provided – with 86% of mothers deciding to carry their babies to term after seeing them during an ultrasound! More than 400 clients were tested through the new outreach of STD testing and treatment. 5,885 students at 30 schools in Colorado Springs and the surrounding area were taught the importance of living a lifestyle of purity as part of Life Network's "Education for a Lifetime". In addition, since 2014, Life Network relocated one of their offices on the west side of Colorado Springs, to a much larger, highly visible location in close proximity to the local Planned Parenthood abortion clinic. Both locations also offer "LifeSteps", a parenting education and mentorship program in which clients cover many topics relating to pregnancy and parenting from pregnancy until their child is two years old. 


