- The council's seminarian support program is ongoing. Ken plans on inviting our sponsored seminarians to the All Saints Day event, the Thanksgiving Basket drive distribution event, and the Christmas Party.
- Ken led the council in the prayer for vocations.

IX. Committee Reports - Facilitated by Michael Burkett

Membership - Roger Giudici

- Supreme's Council Church drive initiative was held during the ministry fair on October 7.
- The council received two new Form 100's. One is a new member, Brendan Love, and the other is a transfer, Dave Simonson. Paul Sciera spoke on behalf of Brendan and Dave Martz spoke for Dave Simonson. Roger said that he also has two 'prospect cards,' and is working to follow-up on both.
- Roger discussed that it may be prudent to have new people coming into the council go through an interview process concerning council activities in order to get them engaged. Based on his experience, new members who do not get involved in council activities straight away end up drifting away. They then end up becoming a paper Knight, just sending in their check once a year.
- Because Roger is now Faithful Navigator for the Assembly, in addition to being District Warden. Therefore he needs someone to step up as membership chairman. One approach may be appointing someone temporarily. In any event, Roger will help train a new recruit.
- Bottomline, regardless everyone needs to help recruit new members.

- The annual Tootsie Roll drive is underway.
 - The first venue was held at King Soopers in Castle Pines: on *September 22 and 2, and September 29th and 30th.*
 - The next ones are scheduled for *October 6 and 8, and October 13, 14, and 15* at the Wildcat King Soopers, volunteers are still needed.
- Thanksgiving Basket drive is now underway, Ken Balcerzak has the lead (see attachment pgs. 9 & 10). .
 - Ken mentioned that with all the organizations asking for help the council is looking at 400 to 500 baskets in addition to the families that the parish will be supporting.
 - There will be notice in the church bulletin this weekend.
 - A flyer will be going into the bulletin on the weekend of the 28/29th of October.
 - Gary said that he can obtain some less expensive cardboard boxes instead of plastic containers, which in then end will save us over \$1000 dollars.
 - In addition, Ken has an idea to put together a Thanksgiving Basket Drive banner, more to follow on this initiative.
 - Distribution of goods will take place on the November 18.

c. Council Activity Report - Nereus Lobo/Paul Sciera

- Highway cleanup was held on October 7th, we had a good turnout of folks.
- The October council social is scheduled for the 20th, start time is 5:30PM, the Scieras will be hosting.
- Breakfast Burritos is scheduled for October 29.

d. Family Report - Tony Mancuso

- First Annual All Saint's celebration and fundraiser is scheduled for November 4 after the 5PM mass (see attachment pg. 11).
 - This will be in lieu of the Trunk-or-Treat
 - Our council has been asked to help with the food. Possibly a lasagna dinner.
 - Therefore, the spaghetti dinner slated for October 14 has been cancelled.
- Due to a conflict, this year's Christmas Party is scheduled for Sunday December 10. Tony will confirm the date with Joanne and book a Santa Claus. Gary mentioned that he will be doing the hams, and that Tony needs to check with Ron Gerber about doing the turkeys.
- Additionally, Tony is soliciting suggestions for various family activities.

e. <u>Culture of Life report</u> – Roger Giudici for Mike McGinnis

- On October 15, the Alternatives Pregnancy Center will bring the mobile clinic and speak at 8:30 and 10:30AM masses. The Respect Life Committee will be serving donuts and has asked the council to assist in this event.
- This weekend the Colorado Springs Diocese is having all churches read a consecration prayer to commemorate the 100th anniversary of our Lady of Fatima and the miracle of the sun.
- The Colorado Springs Respect Life committee is working on developing a Right-to-Life website that should be ready sometime in October.
- Bishop Sheridan's Respect Life dinner is scheduled for October 27 at the Broadmoor Hotel. The council has table, there are six seats left. Cost is \$55/person.
- January 20, 2018, there is a celebration of life march being planned that will end up at the Denver capital building. Rallies are slated from 1 to 2PM, more to follow.

Instructions on What to Assemble/Purchase for Your Family's Thanksgiving Dinner Gift

How to Package

To keep the contents of all Thanksgiving Dinners consistent, we ask that you please obtain the following ingredients for your gift and use these parameters to guide your purchasing:

- 1. Obtain Turkey or Ham, FROZEN, and the "trimmings" to serve 4-6 people.
- 2. Use plastic laundry basket you purchase to house all your ingredients.
- Feel free to wrap your basket with clear/see through cellophane and tie at top with a nice ribbon/bow
- 4. Be sure to include a nice gift card saying what family the gift is from, e.g.,
 - a. "Have a Happy Thanksgiving, From the Smith Family, Pax Christi Catholic Church and the Rev. Robert F. Houlihan, S.J., Council of the Knights of Columbus, Highlands Ranch, Colorado"
- When delivering the baskets at church, please let the Knights know whether this is a basket suitable for a Large family (5 or more people) or a small family (2-4) people.
