Unfinished Business:

Tom Harding discussed the Sacred Heart Retreat House golf tournament on Monday, August 19th. \$100 per player for cart & golf, lunch and awards. 6:30 AM registration and 7:30 AM shotgun start. Contact Tom if you want to sponsor a hole, donate raffle prizes/gift certificates.

Tom Harding suggested the Charter certificate for the council be suitably matted and framed for preservation, as well as possibly displaying with awards the council has received.

Mike Melo requested that prior to ordering the Peaches from Palisades that enough orders have been committed to pay for the truck rental. The cost per box is estimated at \$16 and the sale is \$25, which is considerably cheaper than the store. Assuming truck rental is \$200 and gas is \$150, roughly 40 boxes is a

break-even number.

New Business:

Tom Odle motioned that the council authorizes the funds, approximately \$30, for a plaque to recognize an individual for their exemplary service to the council. The motion was seconded and passed.

Sacred Heart Retreat House (SHRH) is having a benefit raffle. The council received four tickets for \$10 each. A motion was made to purchase the tickets and any winnings would be donated equally to the two parishes. After some discussion on donating any winnings to SHRH, it was agreed that the golf tournament provides donates to SHRH, and the motion remained as splitting any winnings between each of the parishes. The motion was seconded and passed.

The affirmation letter of support for the clergy was distributed. The writing was approved for publishing and display.

As a ministry at Pax Christi, the council has been asked to assist with presentations at the mini missions. The topic of "What it means to be a Catholic father, husband and Knights of Columbus member" was agreed at the last planning meeting. Joe Nickels will be putting together a PowerPoint presentation. Please send him any ideas you have on the topic.

The question was raised, "Are the Knights planning to be represented at the Pax Christi ministry fair?" Joe Nickels indicated that a table was at past ministries fairs and asked for volunteers to man the table this year.

Special Olympics is August 10/11. There will be five venues. To volunteer to help, you must be 14 years or older.

Tom Harding reported that Sister Roberta, Father Bob's sister, finished her retreat recently. She thanks the council for their thoughts and prayers. A scrapbook of Father Bob is at SHRH. Sister Roberta is working on making a copy for the council.

Budget published. Discussion centered on raising the budget line item for the computer, as \$500 is not sufficient. It was agreed to make the line item \$1,000. Additional discussion was focused on budgeted items (Altar Server Recognition, Computer and Past Grand Knight Dinners) that were not spent in the past fiscal year. This needs to be avoided, particularly in a non-profit organization. A motion was made to approve the budget as amended. The motion was seconded and passed.

A motion was made to frame the approved affirmation of support for the clergy. A copy should be hand delivered to each parish priest. The motion was seconded and passed.
