Rosary Walk

Dear Brother Knights:

The Knights of Columbus have a special affinity to Our Blessed Mother. We have an opportunity to help out Pax Christi and also live out our Faith. The Council is organizing the Construction of a Rosary Walk on Saturday May 5th. Construction is planned to run from about 8:00 am

until about noon. The Rosary walk is a big project; over 180 yards long (much bigger than Gary Mayfield's credit card Rosary, ask him about it). On the 5th we hope to have the path laid out and stepping stones laid out for each of the beads. In reality this will be an ongoing project with lots of opportunities for improvements over time. We have already discussed putting a Cross at the beginning of the Walk, possibly a statue of Mary at the beginning of the first decade, benches along the way and possibly flower. But those are all for the future, come out on the 5th and let's get this started correctly.

Leonard Leyba and I marked out the approximate path and the location of the stepping stones for the walk. The walk paces off at 180 yards so there is a fair amount of work to be done.

The plan for the day is as follows.

- 1) Rake the dead plants and as many live plants out of the proposed path as possible.
- 2) Rototill the path
- 3) Lay down weed barrier along the whole path
- 4) Lay down stepping stones
- 5) Lay down Breeze material on top of the Weed Barrier
- 6) Tamp down the Breeze Material.
- 7) Put up Marker posts.

NEEDS:

I plan to have the supplies on site with the exception of the Breeze Material

I would like to have 3-4 pickup trucks to get the Breeze material (6-8 tons) from Santa Fe Sand and Gravel. If anyone has a pickup truck that would be able to transport material please let me know.

I will need someone to coordinate getting the Breeze material

I would like to have a roto tiller (we can rent one but if someone has one that will save up some money).

We will need shovels, rakes, tampers and one post hole digger.

It will be good to have a couple of people to coordinate making sure we have enough water, etc.

Thank you all for your consideration. Please let me know if you can help.

Leonard Needs Help

As some of you may know, in addition to my Knights of Columbus commitment, I also Chair the Fair Trade Coffee Ministry for our Parish.

It is more than just about coffee so I would like to share some information about the ministry with you.

The Maya Ixil community exists in Guatemala's remote volcanic highlands – deep within the Rainforest. Their remote location has kept these gentle people amongst the worlds most impoverished, neglected and uneducated.

Here in Quiche Guatemala is where the farmer hand picks 4000 coffee cherries in three different pickings which ultimately equal one pound of coffee. They plant their precious coffee trees amongst the taller Rainforest trees. The coffee is "Chemical Free". The small growers use only natural fertilizers such as those that come from the tree itself.

The Earth Friendly Coffee company founded by Diane Hughes, has a roasting facility right here in Denver, until the indigenous are able to roast the beans themselves. This will give them 30 – 50% more of the specialty coffee dollar. The Maya Ixil already has the building for the roasting facility but need to raise enough money for roasting equipment.

Diane pays the farmers a premium above the Fair Trade Price (avg about 50% more) to obtain the higher quality coffee beans as all coffee beans are not alike.

Leonard Leyba, chairperson for 4 years, needs your help in order for this to happen. He needs help selling the coffee after all the Masses. Leonard usually does the Saturday 5pm Mass.

He advertised in the bulletin for 6 weeks and still has no volunteers. It takes about 10 minutes after Mass, no book keeping. If you can help, please contact Leonard at 303-794-7797.

Eight people were in attendance. We will again pray the Rosary to save babies from death through abortion on May 11th, our usual 2nd Sunday of the month. Thanks to all participants. John Paul II invited Christians throughout the world to rediscover the spiritual kindness of the rosary. Every second Sunday of the month, the Knight of Columbus of Pax Christi continues to join with millions of other knights in celebrating this 850 year old prayer as we pray for the sanctity of life. Upon joining the Knight's, each member is given a rosary, distinct to the order, and encouraged to pray with it often. This challenge is taken so seriously that captain Daniel O'Callahan of the New York Fire department, who died in the 9-11 tragedy, was found with his Knight of Columbus rosary beads in hand. Our council strives to introduce this prayer as a tool for Catholics as they seek to deepen their faith.

District of Columbia Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act

Longtime pro-life leader Representative Trent Franks recently introduced H.R. 3803, the District of Columbia Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act in the U.S. House of Representatives. The bill would ban abortions at 20 weeks and later in our nation's capital. There are 159 co-sponsors to the bill. Also Senator

Mike Lee introduced a Senate version of the bill. I am asking all of you to please contact your Representative and Senators to ask their support.

LET FREEDOM RING!!

You might think that is a strange banner for a pro-life article, but given the sense of the times I think it is most appropriate. What is under assault today is our freedom of religion. Perhaps we should think of this in terms of a history lesson. Let's go back to November 11, 1620 when the passenger ship "Mayflower" landed in the new world. The purpose of the people on that ship was to free themselves to practice their religion which was under considerable persecution in England. That's right; our initial Americans came here for freedom of religion. It is inseparable from our birth as a nation and is firmly ensconced in those documents later crafted by our founding fathers to proclaim this country as what the late president Ronald Reagan would say "is the beacon of light to the world." That very premise is under assault today by the present elected leadership of our country. It's most visible proponent is the Health and Human Services (HHS) mandate that our Catholic institutions, hospitals, colleges, high schools, charitable organizations) provide contraception, abortion and sterilization opportunities to our employees. Make no mistake about this. If the government can force this, then what is next, selection of our bishops, priests, deacons and pastors (as happens in China)? Perhaps then, under the guise of maintaining order for the common good, news will be edited to only portray what government determines is good for us. Have these things been tried before? Of course, think of the now defunct union of the soviet socialist

republic. And even today we have Cuba and North Korea. The commonality that all those repressive and failed and failing societies have in common is the suppression of religious freedom. Where there is no religious freedom life is held of little or no value. That is fact! If you don't want us to end up that way please have the courage to write or text or e-mail or face book our senators and your representatives both at state and federal level and ask them to shut that mandate down. Our faith, children and grandchildren demand our courage.

The Holy Thursday liturgy is celebrated in the evening because Passover began at sundown. It shows

the need for cleansing with water (a symbol of baptism) in the Mandatum, or washing in Jesus' washing the feet of His disciples, and in the priest's stripping and washing of the altar. Our Grand Knight, Paul Sciera, represented all Knights by having his feet washed by Father Brian, along with 11 others.

The action of the Church on this night also witnesses to the Church's esteem for Christ's Body present in the consecrated Host in the Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, carried in solemn procession to the Altar of Repose, where it remained 'entombed' until the communion service on Good Friday. In an impressive and moving ceremony, our Fourth Degree Honor Guard Knights, in full regalia, escorted the Blessed Sacrament from the Church Hall to the Chapel, following Father Brian and Deacon Tim in procession.

And finally, there is the Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament by the people during the night, just as the disciples stayed with our Lord during His agony on the Mount of Olives. Again, our Fourth Degree Honor Guard kept watch, standing at attention during the adoration period.

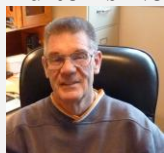
