AARP TAX Aide

Knights and Lady Knights

The AARP Tax Aide is still going on. Every year, many seniors and low-income families have to pay for tax preparation. Sadly, their refund goes to the tax preparer. Our service is free!

Our group is called AARP Tax-Aide, a not-for-profit arm of the AARP Foundation. AARP Tax-Aide is the nation's largest, free, volunteer-run tax assistance service. For over 40 years, AARP, in conjunction with the IRS, has provided this tax service for low to middle-income families and taxpayers 60 and older. Jointly, AARP and the IRS, provide all the necessary training, training materials, supplies, and computers

There currently are not enough tax preparers or greeters. Many days, we must turn people away because we can only complete a limited number of returns. AARP needs your help to prepare and file their taxes.

AARP also needs volunteers to greet the clients that come into our tax sites. To be a greeter, these volunteers should be comfortable around people and have good organizational abilities.

Tax preparers become certified after taking 3 days of classroom training and passing the IRS exam in January. Greeters only need to take 2 hour training on one day in January. The actual tax preparation is done February 1st until April 17th, at the downtown Denver site, Monday through Friday from 10:00 AM until 3:00 PM. Volunteers can work from 1 to 5 days a week during the tax season.

We are very blessed. Please pay it forward and help the less fortunate with your God given abilities. 

The Rev. Robert F. Houlihan, S.J. Educators Series. number 2.0, 2013.

Father Vincent Capodanno received, posthumously, the Congressional Medal of Honor, the highest military honor that our nation can bestow on a military individual. He joined the Navy as a chaplain in 1965 and volunteered to serve with the Marines in Vietnam. Marines gave him the title "Grunt Padre" because of his participation in the field with the Marines on their various missions. On September Although seriously wounded, Fr. Vincent continued to minister to fallen soldiers. He died, after taking 27 bullets, caring for his beloved Marines, administering spiritual aid, spiritual comfort and last rites to the seriously injured. In recognition of his selfless sacrifice, Fr. Vincent was awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor on December

Thirty years after his death, on May 21, 2006, FR. Vincent Capodanno was publically declared a "Servant of God", the first step to canonization.

May 11, 2011 the Marine Corps Heritage Foundation honored him through the dedication of the "Sacrifice Window" in the National Museum of the Marine Corps.



A Note About This Newsletter

Brothers, in place of the February newsletter, I initiated a survey about the use of this newsletter. My thanks to all Brothers who responded (19 responses). Here are the questions and results.

- 1. Is it being read? All but one said yes. So, I assume that those that did not respond do not read the newsletter.
- 2. Is it useful? Most said yes.
- 3. Is it informative? **Most said yes.**
- 4. Is it a source of reference to you for future activities? **Only about half responded positive.**
- 5. Is the format easy to navigate and read? **Most said** yes, but several got lost in the three column format.
- 6. Can you find an item of interest easily? **Most said** yes.
- 7. Are the articles easy to understand? All said yes.
- 8. Is it too long? **Many thought it was too long.**
- 9. Is it repetitive with email information you have already received? Most thought it was repetitive with previous emails, but some also thought that it is a good recap of our activities and serves as a historical record of our council.
- 10. Do you have any suggestions on content? On format? **Most did not have a suggestion on content and format.**
- 11. Do you like the present format? Most said yes.
- 12. Do you think we should not have a newsletter? **All said yes.**
- 13. We are currently looking at putting articles on the Web Site and linking to them in an email so that all you would see is a headline and a link. If you want to read more, you would click on the link. What is your opinion of this approach? A few thought this was a good idea, but most thought the present format was OK.
- 14. Please include any other suggestions? **None of significance**.

As a result of this survey, I have initiated the following changes:

- 1. Change the format to two columns instead of three. I might try a one column (as in this article) later to see if this is better. This should make navigating the columns on a page easier.
- 2. Reduce the size of the newsletter by moving large articles (like the January Sandy Hook article, Alternative Pregnancy Center Prayer Requests or large committee reports and articles) to Google Docs and provide a link (the link above is an example). An article title and teaser along with the link may appear prior to the link.
- 3. I have put off for now the suggestion of making this a quarterly publication. Reporting on three months of activities would just make the newsletter all that much longer, even if we shorten the articles. We'll look at this at a later time.

Once again I need to reiterate that this is **your newsletter**. The information in it comes from you, especially the Program Directors and Officers. I urge you to submit articles about your specific program. This is a wonderful opportunity to acquaint all members about your program purpose, and opportunities available for all to participate. Remember the What, When Where, Why and How of news reporting. This newsletter is only as good and interesting as you make it. All I do as editor is put it all together.
