

Over 450 Knights from all over Colorado attended this annual event from April 24th through April 27th. This year's event was held at the Embassy Suites in Loveland. 45 priests and deacons attended the clergy dinner on Thursday evening, 20 new knights went thru 1st degree, and our very own Jon Herskovitz was elected the new state warden.

Our council also garnered three other awards, one for Church activities for the construction of the Rosary Walk, a state membership award for reactivating members who let their membership lapse, and the Surge With Service Award.








