XI. Lecturer – Alan Brown/Ben Stancati

The Rev. Robert F. Houlihan S.J. Educator Series

- This month lecture was given by Alan Brown, and the subject matter discussed centered on the Blessed Virgin Mary. Alan recommended reading a book called "Walking with Mary, a biblical journey from Nazareth to the Cross," by Dr. Edward Sri of the Augustine Institute. The book studies the life of Mary and the perils that she endured and the sacrifices that she made as the Mother of Jesus, all important for salvation history. While being the Mother of Jesus Christ, we tend to forget that Mary was also human, with all the frailties of being human except for one, she was without sin, e.g. The Immaculate Conception. Nevertheless, Mary had to take the step towards answering Gods call. God is calling all of us to help in his plan, but many of us do not answer that call. Mary was a great example for us to answer with zeal and say Yes to God. In the book, Dr. Sri reviews the Annunciation, Mary's Fiat, the Visitation with Elizabeth, the birth in Bethlehem, the Presentation in the temple and meeting with Simeon, walking in darkness when Jesus is lost and then found in the temple at age 12, Mary's choice at Cana, standing at the cross of Jesus and finally, Mary crowned with Glory. It is a wonderful book to better understand the biblical background behind her many choices and the amazing path that she took to support God's plan.

What is a practical Catholic?

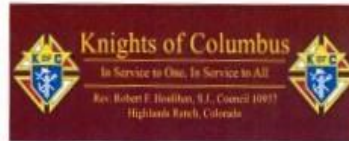
