The Rev. Robert F. Houlihan S.J. Educator Series

This month's discussion centered on Our Lady of Fatima, and was given by former Worthy Grand Knight, Joe Musso. As an introduction, Joe mentioned that one of our parishioners, Ms Marylou Matz is strongly passionate about the Blessed Virgin Mary, specifically the Lady of Fatima" visitations. What happened was that on 13 May 1917, our Blessed Mother appeared in Fatima Portugal to three children, Lucia, Francisco, and Jacinta. The visitations continued for six months thereafter on the 13th of each month. In the course of the monthly visitations our Blessed

Mother called upon not only on the children but all people of faith to devote themselves to the Immaculate Heart of Mary by praying the rosary daily. Additionally, Mary revealed three secrets to the children over the course of her appearance to them: 1. they were shown hell, where the souls of the sinners were sent; 2. they were warned of another great war if her requests were not heeded, and 3., the third secret has never been completely revealed, yet speculation is that it centered on the eventual arrival of a key historical church figure that would be instrumental in the downfall of Communism, e.g. St Pope John Paul II. Finally, Joe mentioned that Marylou Matz will be receiving a Blessed Mother – Lady of Fatima statue on 10 October and will have it for one week. She is planning on hosting rosary praying session at her house during that week in honor of both the Fatima visitations and the Blessed Mother, more to follow.

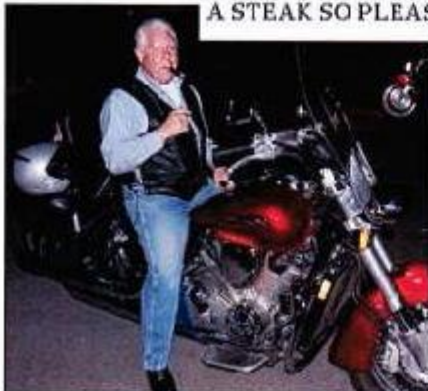
