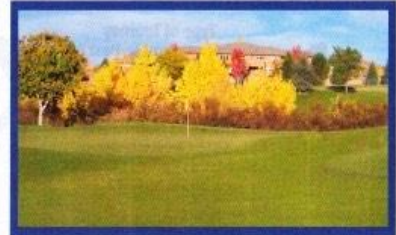

*Relics of Christ's Passion to be presented at
St. Jude Catholic Church
in celebration of the
Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy*

St. Jude Catholic Church will host the Relics of the Passion Program at 6:00pm on Wednesday May 25, 2016.

The event designed to connect participants to the roots of their faith, is sponsored by St. Jude's in collaboration with the Apostolate for Holy Relics (AHR), an organization founded 10 years ago in Los Angeles. The AHR is guardian for more than 1,200 relics organized into special collections, such as the 8 rare relics that make up the Relics of the Passion. The AHR utilizes its collections:

- To increase appreciation of the origins, spiritual, historical and theological value of relics.
- To promote the devotional veneration of relics.
- To help preserve and safeguard relics for future generations.

The Relics of the Passion collection includes:

- A piece of the True Cross, which was discovered by St. Helena.
- A piece of the Holy Table (Mensae Coenae D.N.J.C.), from the room where the Last Supper took place.
- A piece of the Column of Flagellation.
- A piece of the Crown of Thorns
- A replica of the Holy Nail, fashioned using filings from the true nails, making it a relic of a lesser class.
- A relic from the head of St. Longinus, the Centurion who pierced the side of Christ.
- A picture of (the effigy of) the Veil of Veronica touched to the original with a Vatican seal attesting to the fact.
- A piece of the exterior wrapping for the Shroud of Turin (Sindonis D.N.J.C.)

- Time commitment: 2-3 hours per week at youth group plus attendance at monthly CORE team training meetings..

Confirmation CORE Team:

Meets weekly Wednesdays 6:00-8:00pm

- Serves teens seeking to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation (typically grades 8-12).
- CORE team is asked to assist with the spiritual formation and catechesis of teens seeking to deepen their faith through the Sacrament of Confirmation at sessions through talks, games and small groups.

What is the Year of Mercy?

Pope Francis has long made mercy one of the primary focuses of his papacy. Because he has sought to reach those in the fold as well as those on the periphery, the pope declared that the Jubilee of Mercy would begin on December 8, 2015 (the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary) and conclude on November 20, 2016 (the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe).

It's a special, holy year which will focus on the breadth of God's mercy and forgiveness.

A Message from Pope Francis

"Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I have often thought of how the Church may render her mission to be a witness to mercy; and we have to make this journey. It is a journey which begins with spiritual conversion.

Therefore, I have decided to announce an Extraordinary Jubilee which has at its center the mercy of God. It will be a Holy Year of Mercy.

This Holy Year will commence on the next Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception and will conclude on Sunday, 20 November 2016, the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

Do not forget that God forgives all, and God forgives always.

Let us never tire of asking forgiveness. Let us henceforth entrust this Year to the Mother of Mercy, that she turn her gaze upon us and watch over our journey: our penitential journey, our year-long journey with an open heart, to receive the indulgence of God, to receive the mercy of God."
