- The issue at stake concerns the right to be able to freely express one's religious beliefs and views at various levels.
- On Mother's Day, 450 seed packets were distributed to the parishioners; it seems to have been a success since none remain.
- Volunteers are needed to help with the *Rose For Motherhood* initiative, which involves reading a poem and handing out a rose at Mass.
  - o Ron Gerber is the activity lead and POC.
  - o Two baptisms where held on April 24, one during 8:30am mass and one after the 10:30am mass.

- The council's college scholarship/stewardship award program is complete, and the winner was Rory Brown, Alan Brown's daughter.
