I. General

- The Council was called to order at 8:10AM by Grand Knight (GK) William Hensen.
- Opening Prayers were offered by Bill Hensen and Ken Balcerzak.
- The council recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

• The business meeting minutes for April 2018 were read-in for approval by the Grand Knight (GK) Bill Hensen. Bill then called for a motion to accept the April minutes as read. John Alfeld made a motion to accept as read. Gary Mayfield provided a second. And after no further discussion, the minutes were unanimously approved.

III. Grand Knight Report – William Hensen

- Correspondence:
 - Thank You note from Alternative Pregnancy Center (see attachment pg.12).
 - Letter received from Supreme stating that our council is in good standing.
 - Thank you received from Catholic Charities of Douglas County.
- Events/activities/general information:
 - State Convention Annual Meeting was held April 26-29, Hyatt Regency DTC. Delegates to the Convention were Steve Froseth and Gary Mayfield. The council came in third in the Blue Division, and was ranked 13 in the State.
 - The Green Chili Cook-off event was held on May 5 after the 5pm Mass. Joe Regnery won First Place for his chili and Joe Musso won First Place for his margarita.
 - Council Dues are now way past due for 2018. Please send a check for \$36 made out to Council 10937 to Steve Froseth. There are about 28 members who have not yet paid the 2018 dues. We need to reach out to these folk to see what their intentions are.
 - Our council calendar has been put up for the balance of 2018 thru June 2019. The plan is to switch this over to Google Calendars as soon as possible in order to give members better access to upcoming events. Steps are being taken to add the calendar to the 10937 website.

- <u>Child Safe Environment training is being offered at the Parish:</u> Please note that this training is mandatory for all Knights who help at Parish events involving Family and any youth participation. The next sessions are scheduled for May 14. Informational flyers are located in the Great Hall, so please make an effort to get signed up.

- <u>Celebration of Corpus Christi will be on June 3, 2018</u>. The council has been asked to help in this event. Chris Kennedy is our contact person with the Parish. The Knights will do a Beer and Brats style luncheon after the procession.

IV. Chaplain's Report - Father Marek Krol

- Father Krol in his report addressed the following items:
 - Father called for the establishment of a First Degree KOC Leadership/Mentorship program as a way of taking a vested interest in new members. The leadership interface and mentoring will begin before the perspective candidate's First Degree exemplification, and will continue for a period of time after attainment of their First Degree. The purpose of the program to ensure that new 1st Degree members become engaged and do not end-up fading away. Field Agent Dave Carey also mentioned that there is an initiative called the 'Shinning Armor Award' for new First Degree members that just might help in pursuit of this goal. In the end this means we are all responsible for making this a viable program.
 - As part of his summer break program, Seminarian Victor Brinkman will be back with us at Pax for two months during the summer season.
 - Parish members, and especially KOC council members, when witnessing a fellow parishioner doing something wrong, should not be afraid to lovingly point out the wrong doing. When it comes to the salvation of a person's soul, upholding moral laws, and sharing Christian values, worrying about being political correct or offending someone should be of little to no consideration.
 - The Corpus Christi Celebration that is being planned for June 3. On Sunday June 3 there will be only one Mass at 9am, followed by a procession and picnic celebration. Father will need help from the council broken down into three teams: one cooking (brats and hotdogs), one setting up tables, and one directing people where to park. In addition, along with the council being responsible for building one of the altars, we may need some Knights to help with the carrying of the Corpus Christi canopy. Concerning the procession, Father said that should take between 45 minutes to one hour. Chris Kennedy is the council's POC and parish interface for this event.
 - The Pax Christi parish picnic is scheduled for August 25. Joe and Jackie Regnery are the parish action folks that will be coordinating this parish wide event.

- Gary Mayfield asked for a round of applause for Mike. His program came in First Place for the State. What put him over the top was his program report, which scored a 96 out of a possible 100 points, well done.

g. Youth Report - Alan Brown/Ben Stancati

- Pax Christi Youth Program
 - Chenele Shaw, Pax Youth Director, has a summer schedule and is requesting adult help to act as chaperones for the youth group.
 - The plan is to take the group to various activities and places such as Elitch Gardens Theme Park.
- KOC Stewardship Scholarship Program:
 - This year's winner was Austin Yarosh.
 - Scholarship checks will need to go out in July.
 - For the next Fraternal Year budget the scholarship amount needs to be increased from \$500 to \$750.
- Alan reminded everyone that Bishop Sheridan will be at Pax on Tuesday May 22 for Confirmation. There are approximately 20 to 25 youth receiving Confirmation.

X. Advocates Report – Dave Petteys

- Dave has made a request to the Financial Secretary that the council order a set of KOC by-laws booklets. At fifty cents a-piece we, therefore, can order enough for the entire membership.
- Dave mentioned that while District type exemplifications are fine in their own right and maybe be expedient, the KOC by-laws specifically state that a council should try and foster their own.

XII. New Business

- Bill mentioned that the refrigerator in the Rectory broke down, requiring Father Krol to purchase another. Bill made a suggestion that the council help defray the cost by giving the Pax Parish \$500 towards this purchase. Since this is not a budgeted line item Bill had to request that a motion be made to spend the \$500. Jim Egan made the motion, Joe Regnery provided a second, after some discussion, the vote was unanimous in favor of spending the money. Also the Lady Knights will also be giving the parish an additional \$500.
- 2018–19 Slate of Officers.
 - Grand Knight (GK) Bill Hensen presented a proposed slate of officers list for the KOC 2018 2019 Fraternal Year.
 - Per subsequent discussion, some additions, deletions, and corrections had to be made to the proposed list. Roger also submitted Matt Bahnemann's name as a nomination for Treasurer. A corrected and updated copy is attached (see attachment pg.14).
 - Upon completion of the discussion, the GK asked three times for additional nominations from the floor and none were presented, so the nominations were closed at this time.
 - Yet because those members not in attendance at the business meeting must be given the opportunity to review the list and submit other names, a final vote was tabled until the next business meeting.
- 2018 19 New Fraternal Year Budget (see attachment pgs.10&11).
 - On behalf of the Grand Knight, Steve Froseth presented the council's budget for the next KOC Fraternal Year (2018-19).
 - Per subsequent discussion, Roger Giudici wanted to know why money that had been allocated in the 2017-18 fraternal year budgets as a charitable disbursement to the 'Bishop's Appeal' was still being

- carried on the 2018 19 proposed budget. Roger pointed out that since this money had been allocated via the 2017-18 fraternal year budgets it needs to be spent before the end of June.
- Upon completion of the discussion, GK Bill Hensen requested that a motion be made to accept the proposed amended budget for the new fraternal year. Roger Giudici made a motion to accept, Dave Petteys provided a second, there was no further discussion.
- Yet because those members not in attendance need time to review the draft budget and provide comment, GK Bill Hensen tabled the final vote on it until the June business meeting.

XIV. Field Agent Report - David Cary

- Dave's discussion addressed the number of funerals he had to attend over the past four months for brother Knights. Some have been personal friends and acquaintances. He went on to stress the importance of developing a relationship with him sooner rather than later. Believe or not, more often than not, the funeral of a brother Knight is when the KOC Field Agent meets the wife of the deceased for the very first time. Because from a business and personal relationship perspective Dave would rather get to know the wife of the brother Knight well before the funeral, and not the day of it.
- Dave also gently reminded us that the money paid via our dues goes straight into a fraternal based insurance bucket. And then when the time comes, this money is used to pay benefits directly to the family of a program participating brother Knight's family. Since 1994, the KOC has paid out in excess of 14 million dollars in family fraternal benefits via the insurance program. This program offers a personal faith based touch not known in other insurance programs because we are not a stock company. That is why it is important to become a participating insurance member.

XV. District Deputy Report – Roger Giudici for Bernie Kuta

- Roger had a few things to pass on:
 - The KOC State organizational meeting, scheduled to be held on July 14 at the Hyatt Regency in the Denver Tech Center. A new committee/program structure is in the works that will be based on these four areas: Faith, Family, Community, and Life
 - The District 9 organizational meeting is scheduled for August 18 at our Lady of the Visitation in Elizabeth.

- Roger also mentioned that the KOC organization has changed its rules on honor guards for funerals.
 Any Brother Knight in good standing, and immediate family members, regardless of degree attained, may have an honor guard present.
