XVI. **Good of the Order**

- **Lecturer – Alan Brown/Ben Stancati**

- This month's discussion was about an article that appeared in the May 2018 edition of Columbia magazine, pages 8-12 (see attachment pg.12). The story concerns retired U.S. Army Captain, Gary M. Rose, Vietnam Veteran, and brother Knight, who was recently awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor at a White House ceremony which took place on Oct 23, 2017. Since the inception of the medal during the Civil War, only 3519 have been awarded, a majority of them posthumous. While the principle focus of the article is an interview with Captain Rose, the staff writers mention that he is the fourth Knight to be awarded the medal. Captain Rose is preceded by Sgt. Major Daniel Daly (1873-1937), double recipient; Reverend (Major) Charles Walters (1927-1967), Chaplain, and fellow Vietnam Veteran, Major General Patrick Brady, 81. The medal was bestowed on Gary for his bravery during the Vietnam War in a highly classified secret mission, 'Operation Tailwind,' that took place in Laos, from 11-14 September 1970. As a Green Beret medic, then Sergeant Rose was exposed to murderous machine gun fire from North Vietnamese Army regulars while treating nearly 70 wounded soldiers. Due to the highly classified nature of the mission, Sgt. Rose was disapproved for the medal in 1971, and instead was awarded the Army's Distinguished Service Cross. With a declassifying of the mission, more information and details on his actions were made known. This then paved the way for the awarding of the Medal of Honor. Today, Gary Rose resides with his wife in Huntsville, Alabama. A past grand Knight of Good Shephard Council 11672, Capt. Rose is currently faithful navigator of Father Jeremiah F. Treacy Assembly in Huntsville.

AN INTERVIEW WITH CAPT. GARY M. ROSE ABOUT HIS SERVICE IN THE VIETNAM WAR

he was passed over. Instead, he was awarded the Distinguished Service Cross in 1971. Rose continued his career in the Army, reaching the rank of Captain before retiring in 1987. He later worked as a technical consultant in the defense and automobile industries.

Today, he resides with his wife in Huntsville, Ala., where he is involved with a number of charitable organizations, including the Knights of Columbus. A past grand knight of Good Shepherd Council 11672 in Huntsville, Capt. Rose currently serves as faithful

Retired U.S. Army Capt. Gary Michael "Mike" Rose, a member of the Knights of Columbus, was recently awarded the Medal of Honor, the nation's highest military accolade, for his bravery during the Vietnam War.

Born in Watertown, N.Y., Oct. 17, 1947, Rose grew up in the Los Angeles area before enlisting in the U.S. Army in 1967. As a Green Beret medic, he was exposed to machine gun fire while treating nearly 70 wounded soldiers during Operation Tailwind, a secret mission in Laos Sept. 11-14, 1970 (see sidebar). Operation Tailwind remained classified for decades, and few details of Rose's actions were made public. As a result, when his name was submitted for the Medal of Honor in 1970,
