Business Meeting – Feb 9, 2019

I. General

- The Council was called to order at 7:58AM by Grand Knight (GK) William Hensen.
- Opening Prayers were offered by Mike Burkett, Ken Balcerzak, and Alan Brown

- The business meeting minutes for January 2019 were read-in for approval by the GK Bill Hensen. Bill then called for a motion to accept the minutes as read. Jim Egan made a motion to accept, Joe Regnery provided a second. After no further discussion a vote was then taken and last month's minutes were unanimously approved.

- The Trustees want to know how much money is left from the Thanksgiving Basket Drive. Steve said there is approximately \$2300 dollars.
- Concerning the insurance liability issue for offsite events, the Trustees respectfully requested that we move forward to put this issue to bed. As part of the discussion, Ken Balcerzak recommended that the council contact our insurance agent get a complete copy of the entire policy, with endorsements. The membership in attendance came to an agreement that this is the best way to proceed.

 - In addition, Dave mentioned that he has contacts who are subject matter experts in long term care who are not affiliated with the KOC organization. Therefore he plans on having one of these individuals at the seminar for those parishioners who are not members of the KOC.
 - He also requested that the event be heavily advertised, recommending a period of 60 days and/or two months.
 - In order to help draw people in the council should consider providing cocktails and heavy hors d oeuvres.
 - This has been tried in some of the parishes in Colorado Springs with good success.
 - Joe Regnery is the action officer for this initiative and will work with both Dave and Father Krol on the details, more to follow.

 - After some further discussion on the issue, the GK then asked for a motion to accept this proposal. Joe Musso provided the motion, Alan Brown a second, a vote was then taken, and it was unanimous.

The plan is to have the event approximately 30 days or so after Easter. Joe Regnery is the action officer for this initiative.

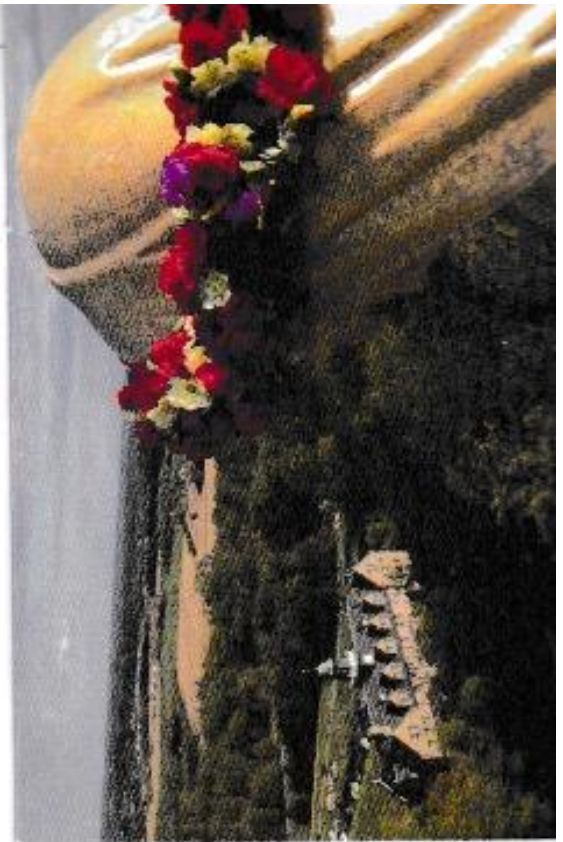
