 - Thérèse has been a highly influential model of sanctity for Catholics and for others because of the simplicity and practicality of her approach to the spiritual life. Together with Saint [Francis of Assisi](#), she is one of the most popular saints in the history of the church.^{[2][3]} [Pope Pius X](#) called her "the greatest saint of modern times".^{[4][5]} Because of her simplistic approach to life, coupled with a deep religious spirituality, she has been made a 'doctor of the church.' Be sure to include a nice gift card saying what family the gift is from, e.g.,

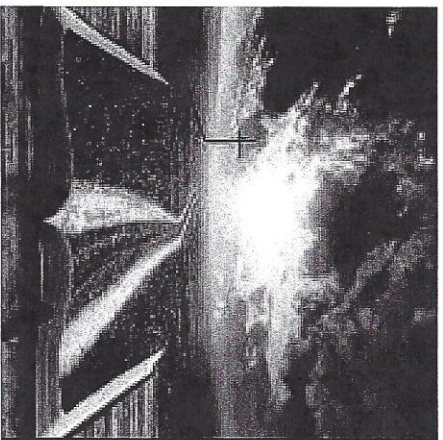
