V. Chaplain's Report - Father Marek Krol

- First, Father Marek mentioned that the All Saints Celebration was a great success and thanked the membership in attendance for all their hard work and support. Concerning the families that attended Father Marek noticed that it was a young crowd, which according to Father seems to be a growing trend in the parish, which is a good sign.
- Next, he mentioned that there were two synods of Bishops that were recently held, one occurred in Germany and the other was held at the Vatican in Rome. Both produced a number of documents, and much of language contained within is very confusing. Because of that fact, Father Krol stressed that we as Knights should not react or take any specific action until the church leadership has had time to properly digest and analyze the language contained within, thus providing proper explanations.
- In association with these synods, Father said that we must pray for Pope Francis and the church overall because it is under attack by Satan. Historically speaking other times had been worse, yet this time it is different because Satan seems to be going after the leadership. Part of the problem here stems from a lack of proper evangelization tied to education. The result then has been the spread of improper and even false messages and information to the Catholic community. Therefore, we as Knights must be careful when it comes to testifying to the truth and the faith, making sure that the correct message is being disseminated.
- Lastly, Father once again stressed that another way that Satan is attacking the church is through the children. Because of their nature, being pure of heart, they are the most vulnerable. Therefore, we as Knights must do what we can to help and assist young parents, especially fathers, in protecting our children from this attack by bringing them closer to Jesus and the faith.

VII. Auditor and Trustees - Joe Musso/Gary Mayfield/William Hensen.

- Joe Musso was the only Trustee in attendance.
- He covered the following topics:
 - First, he discussed the 'Point Men' program, which is being headed up by Dan Donaldson. While the meetings are early on Saturday the program is covering a number of important topics tied to the faith and the church. In support of that effort Alan Brown does a great job with his presentations, providing a plethora of information that helps facilitate the discussion. Joe encourage all to take advantage of this worthwhile program.
 - Next Joe talked about the Sexual Abuse Scandal report just released by the Denver and Colorado Springs Diocese, and how it was being played out in the media. From Joe's perspective the reporting on this topic seemed to be somewhat one-sided, bias, and censured.
 - Father Krol pointed out that the reason for this type of behavior in the press and media is because they are being frustrated by the church. The reality is that this frustration stems from the fact that the church is the only organization left, and a powerful one at that, which refuses to comprise on what we believe in and stand for when it comes to morals and values
 - Concerning the scandal issue, Dan Donaldson added that he has the opportunity to talk to a
 number of priests from all over the country and he agrees with Father Krol that we are under
 attack, Therefore, we need to pray for not only Pope Francis, but for all our priests, Father
 Krol especially. And because of this assault by Satan, Dan stressed that now is the time for
 bold action when it comes to growing our faith and testifying to the truth.
 - Ford Fay pointed out that we as Knights need to make sure that we do not get too defensive about what the media is saying about the scandal issue. Additionally, Ford emphasized that the church leadership, and the Catholic faith-based community as a whole, needs to be transparent about what it is doing to address this issue in a positive manner, and to work on making sure the problem is revolved.
