 Business Meeting – 11 Jan, 2020

I. General

- The Council was called to order at 8:01AM by Grand Knight (GK) Mike Burkett.

VIII. Chancellor’s Update – Leonard Martinez.

- **Refund Support Vocations Program (RSVP):**
 - GK Mike Burkett mentioned that at the planning meeting there was discussion about increasing the budget to cover an additional seminarian, which would bring the number to four.
 - Currently the council is supporting three: Transitional Deacon William Dwyer, Kolbe Kirst, and Timothy O’Connell. Mathew Kane will replace Will Dwyer when Will is ordained in May. The

new seminarian would be Yunior Gonzalez, bringing the number to four. With this change there would be an increase of an additional \$1000 dollars to the council's budget.

- Bill Hensen made a motion to accept the increase, Ford a second. Yet after some discussion it was decided not to go forward with the motion as presented, and it was cancelled.
- Roger Giudici made a new motion that the council go ahead and give \$500 each to our original three seminarians plus increasing the budget by \$500 to cover Yunior Gonzalez, Ford Fay seconded. Then via a side discussion, not part of the motion, Roger recommended that at next month's business meeting, the council discuss adding one additional seminarian, Matt Kane, to the budget. After no further discussion GK Mike Burkett then asked for a vote be taken on Roger's motion, it was unanimous.

 - The Respect Life Committee has a copy of the movie ‘Unplanned.’ The committee is working on having a public showing at Pax, more to follow.

XI. Advocate’s Report – Jim Egan

XII. Unfinished Business

- KOC councils have received approval from Supreme to obtain a Council Credit and Debit Card. At the last meeting the membership in attendance decided to go forward with this initiative. Three cards will be issued – one each to the GK, FS, and Treasurer. At the December meeting it was decided to table the final vote until January. After no further discussion GK Mike Burkett asked for a final vote, and it was unanimous.

 - Leonard Martinez to Chancellor and Ford Fay to Warden.
 - A first announcement/notification was made at the December meeting, with a final announcement being made at today’s meeting,
 - Mike then asked for a vote to be taken to finalize this change, it was unanimous.

XIII. New Business

- The council needs to approve an additional \$500 to the RSVP budget, with the goal of increasing our number of supported seminarians to four. The reasoning here is that the council receives \$100 back from Supreme for every \$500 per seminarian donation (a payback limit of 4).
- New program – 2nd Chance Bicycles to support Veterans, under privileged children, and homeless people – Joe Regnery is the POC for this activity. Roger said that this will be a collaborative effort between the council and the assembly.

XIV. 4th Degree Report – Roger Giudici

- Assembly programs and initiatives:
 - Ushering and presentation of the gifts.
 - 5pm Mass on Saturday, and 8:30 and 10:30am Masses on Sunday.
 - The next ones are scheduled for the January 11 and 12th.
 - Council members are also encouraged to participate.
 - Attire is either council or assembly shirt.
 - The Fisher House outreach initiative:
 - The new action officer is Ford Fay.
 - The next one is scheduled for February 6.
 - For this event Roger and Ford have opted for the assembly to provide the food.

 - Roger would like to do four per year, once per quarter. Yet because the budget is limited, the plan then is to cater two, with the membership providing food for the other two.

 - This will be a special one, commemorating the 120th anniversary of the establishment of the 4th Degree. Therefore, the state is looking to try and get at least 120 3rd Degree Knights to become 4th Degree.
 - Host is the Bethlehem Assembly, Immaculate Heart of Mary parish, in Northglenn.
 - Currently there are three from the council that will attend. Two applicants needed to be read-in, and one did not. After some discussion a vote was taken on the two, it was unanimous.

Assembly meetings would now be reduced to a couple a year, or once per quarter as necessary to focus on assembly centered business such as the voting in of officers. Additionally, to fill in some of the blanks Roger will continue to periodically send out assembly related events to the membership via email.

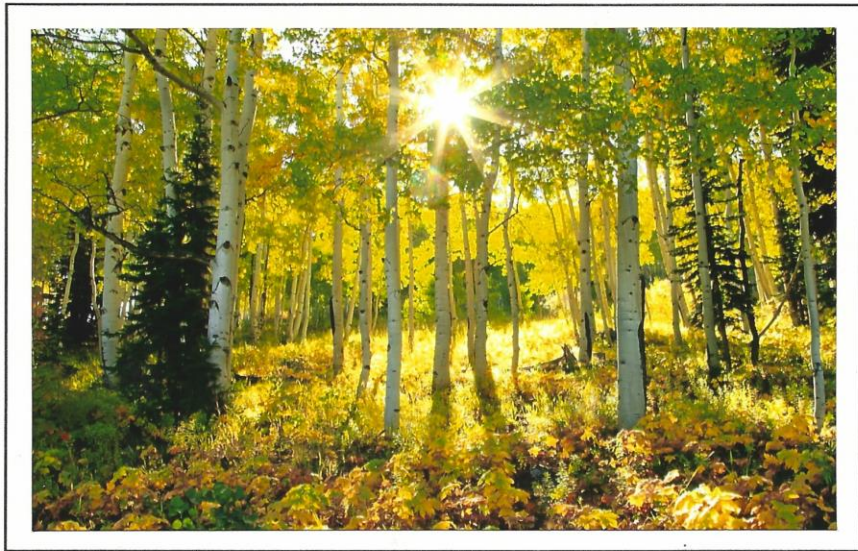

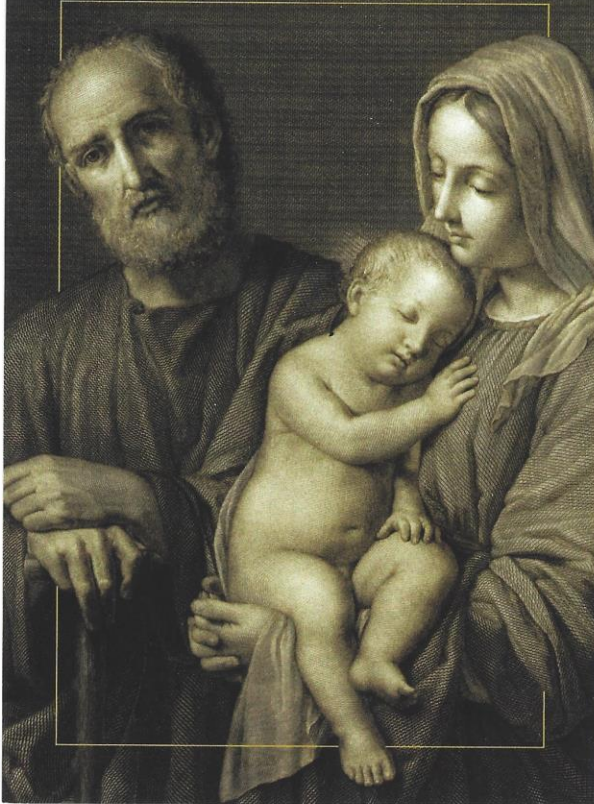
