- Due to the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic the church is in need of financial support to pay the bills. GK Mike Burkett suggested that the council donate \$500 a month to Pax Christi until such time as it is no longer required. While not a budgeted line item, money has been earmarked in the budget for such things. Therefore, the motion would require only one vote. The GK called for a motion to accept the proposal of providing \$500/month financial assistance to the parish until such time as it is no longer needed. Jon Herskovits made a motion to accept the proposal. Joe Regnery provided a second. After no further discussion the GK called for a vote and it was unanimous.
- Bill Hensen has volunteered to be nominating chairman to receive nominations for end-of-year review concerning officer selection for the 2021 Fraternal Year. For those members interested in one of the officer positions, please contact Bill as-soon-as possible.
- GK Mike Burkett presented an initiative calling for the reopening of the St. Elizabeth's pantry in support of Supreme's new "Leave No Neighbor' behind program. Worthy State Secretary Jon Herskovits, and Brother Ben Stancati provided some background information on this new program, to include what other councils are doing nation-wide in support of it. Therefore, the argument presented per the discussion centered on us being a proponent for getting the pantry reopened to serve those in need within the community. GK Mike Burkett said he would take for action approaching Father Krol about this proposed initiative.
- GK Mike Burkett said that he had received an email from District 9 District Deputy George Demetrion, concerning an appeal for help put forth from St Mark Council 1498 (see attachment pg.15). The appeal is calling for providing financial support to a 14year-old pregnant teenage mother by the name of Maggie. Mike recommend that the council look to give \$200 in support of this appeal. While money is available in the budget to support this call for help, Advocate Jim Egan recommended that the council vote on it. Mike asked for a motion to spend \$200 in support of this appeal for help. Mike McGinnis provided the motion. Jim Egan provided the second. After no further discussion the GK called for a vote and it was unanimous.

Support from individuals such as you is vital in the continuing effort to provide our veterans with the best possible care. We acknowledge that no goods or services were provided in exchange for this donation.


