I am writing to you today to share with you an important new initiative by the Colorado Knights of Columbus Charities Fund. Since 2014, the Colorado State Council has passed a resolution, "Combatting Human Trafficking," indicating our desire to see an end to this terrible violation of human rights and dignity. We resolve to support, pray and advocate for change for this worthy cause. We also resolve to "empower survivors with tools for recovery."

Today I am announcing that the Charities Fund is creating a separate initiative to allow members of the Knights of Columbus in Colorado to put words into action. We are launching the Human Trafficking Survivors Recovery Fund.

It is our intention to administer this fund in a manner similar to the way we administer the Ultrasound Initiative. We will have a Chairman who will oversee awareness campaigns, fund raising events and advocate for contributions from local council funds. These funds will be used to assist organizations that provide services to survivors of trafficking. Additionally, the Charities officers will allocate funds received from Pennies from Heaven and donations from the Colorado State Council.

We hope to grow this fund to provide resources to enable trafficking recovery agencies to offer services such as Awareness Training and Public Speaking, Risk and Case Management and Mentorship and Trauma Counseling. The funds raised by the Colorado Knights of Columbus will help to enable organizations in assisting their clients to transition from human trafficking to self-sufficiency and successful reintegration into society.

This is not an easy nor small task; however, it is one that after six years of resolutions and votes demands we become active participants. We will do this by lending our support, financially and materially, to provide a way out for the victims and a way back for survivors.
