Advocate's Report - Robert's Rule Remedial Training

"You have the floor." Those four words are critical to the smooth running of a meeting. The parliamentary procedure for our meetings is governed by Robert's Rules of Order. Within that procedure, a member must be recognized by the chair – that's our Worthy Grand Knight – before they can speak or make a motion.

With just a few exceptions, the chair does not have to recognize any member that has not officially requested recognition. While discussion on a motion is ongoing, a member cannot shout out, "Question!" to try and end debate. Shouting out without recognition is simply rude. The chair must first recognize that member. Once you have the floor you can say what you want.

Regarding calling the question, which is a way to end debate and move to voting on the motion, if debate has dwindled down, calling the question does the membership a disservice since we must now vote on calling the question, which requires a two-thirds majority. Only after that vote passes do we immediately vote on the original motion. There is no discussion.

The agenda for our meeting is published ahead of time. Robert's Rules of Order expects us to follow that agenda. Should the agenda need to be rearranged, the chair should make a motion, or entertain a motion, to suspend the rules. Approval requires a two-thirds majority vote. If a member objects to the order in which agenda items are being taken up, the member must first gain recognition and then say, "Worthy Grand Knight, Point of order." As with calling the question, you cannot simply shout out, "Point of order!" Once you are recognized, you would explain why you think the rules are being broken. The chair has the right to allow or disallow the point and may defer to the parliamentarian on the issue. "Point of order" is usually raised when a member's rights within the meeting are being violated or a rule has been broken. Be nice and use it sparingly. Rarely does our chair skip an agenda item on purpose.

I would urge you to consider taking some comments offline. A comment that is relevant to only one member, made during the meeting, extends the length of the meeting for all members. If what you have to say is relevant to the topic at hand, then gain recognition from the chair and say what you want.

Worthy Grand Knight, this ends the Advocate's report and I yield the floor.
