 - The Council decided to table this initiative and go in a different direction, see new business. Nevertheless, the original motion still needed to be dealt with.

 - Another option was to just let it expire, which will happen at the April business meeting. And because Paul Sciera was not in attendance to withdraw the motion, Jim recommended that the best approach would be to just let it expire.
