- Thanks to all that helped in construction of the Live Nativity back drops, with special shoutouts going to Brother Lombardi for use of his garage and Joe and Jackie Regnery for coordinating this effort, thus ensuring this project was completed well before the start date of 11 December.
- Pax Youth Group Living Nativity initiative:
  - A wonderful project the Advent/Christmas Season, orchestrated by Ms. Julie Smith, Director of Children's Faith Formation.
  - The first event is scheduled for Sunday, 11 December, with continued scheduled showings until the start of Christmas.
