Holy Spirit, I ask you for the gift of Wisdom to better know You and Your divine perfections, for the gift of Understanding to clearly discern the spirit of the mysteries of the holy faith, for the gift of Knowledge that I may live according to the principles of this faith, for the gift of Counsel that I may look for counsel in You and that I may always find it in you, for the gift of Fortitude that no fear or earthly preoccupations would ever separate me from You, for the gift of Piety that I may always serve your majesty with a filial love, for the gift of Fear of the Lord that I may dread sin, which offends you, O my God.

Next is a longer prayer one can pray in its entirety or partially, due to time, incorporating the material from the class.

Prayer for the Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit

O Lord Jesus Christ Who, before ascending into heaven did promise to send the Holy Spirit to finish Your work in the souls of Your Apostles and Disciples, deign to grant the same Holy Spirit to me that He may perfect in my soul the work of Your grace and Your love. With Blessed Virgin

Mary at my side, I humbly ask for the supernatural gifts of:

Knowledge so that my mind works under the action of the Holy Spirit to rightly judge all created things in their relation to God and how to attain Christian perfection. To have certitude about what must be believed and not believed and learn to use all created things in a holy way.

Understanding so that my mind works under the action of the Holy Spirit to receive penetrating intuition into the revealed truths of the faith including the holy scriptures.

Wisdom to understand the heart of God himself, see people and events from God's point of view, and gain intimate relationships with each of the three Divine Persons.

Counsel to receive right judgment for the direction of others and docility to those in rightful authority over me. To judge rightly particular events and what needs to be done, and to receive solutions to difficult and perplexing problems. To be kept from a false conscience.

Piety to have aroused in me a filial love for God and a feeling of profound love for all people as my brothers and sisters. To deeply experience being a son / daughter of God my Father, and for charity in all my relationships — Divine and human — to develop admirably.

Fear of the Lord to draw my soul away from sin out of reverence for God and a desire for union with Him. To govern sensory and worldly pleasures. To receive a profound sense of the purity of God, a desire for genuine humility, and a deep appreciation for the beauty of the spiritual life.

Fortitude to practice virtue with invincible confidence. To overcome all lukewarmness, be valiant in every type of danger, suffer with patience and joy, and be heroic even in small things.

Act of Consecration to the Holy Spirit

On my knees before the great multitude of heavenly witnesses, I offer myself, soul and body to You, Eternal Spirit of God. I adore the brightness of Your purity, the unerring keenness of Your justice, and the might of Your love. You are the Strength and Light of my soul. In You I live and move and am. I desire never to grieve You by unfaithfulness to grace, and I pray with all my heart to be kept from the smallest sin against You. Mercifully guard my every thought and grant that I may always watch for Your light and listen for Your voice and follow Your gracious inspirations. I cling to You and give myself to You and ask You by Your compassion to watch over me in my weakness. Holding the pierced Feet of Jesus and looking at His Five Wounds and trusting in His Precious Blood and adoring His opened Side and stricken Heart, I implore You, Adorable Spirit, Helper of my infirmity, so to keep me in Your grace that I may never sin against You. Infuse me with Your grace, O Holy Spirit of the Father and the Son. Amen

Note: All the sanctifying gifts of the Holy Spirit presume and are built on the foundation of the soul being in a state of grace, that is, free from any mortal sin. Without this state, the person can intellectually and abstractly acknowledge the work of these gifts, but the gifts will remain fundamentally stagnant. With a state of grace, the soul will long for these gifts to be perfected in her for her full development. The sacrament of Confession is key to a state of grace.
