- Cash donation of \$1000 for the Pax Christi parish will be presented to Father Andrzej at the 2021 KOC Christmas Party. Ryan Fesker confirmed that this is a budgeted item.
- Gary Mayfield rose to discuss the severe weather conditions, major tornadoes, that had occurred overnight in the mid-west. Gary suggested that the Council think about maybe providing some kind of relief support if and when needed.
- Leonard Lebya presented a proposal concerning two Pax Christi parishioners, George and Georgina El-Dirani, who have been with Pax Christi for about seven years:
 - Leonard explained that the El-Diranis are of Lebanese decent, and according to family members still currently residing in Lebanon, the conditions there are deplorable.
 - Needed aid to starving people is not getting to them due to endemic government corruption.
 - The El-Diranis, however, are in contact with a local priest in Lebanon, Father Boulus, and through a family friend in Lebanon, have a way of wiring money so it ends up going straight to Father Boulus.
 - Leonard explained that the El-Diranis are seeking help from our Council in the form of a monetary donation in order to help Father Boulus in his efforts to assist these starving families.
 - Paul Sciera rose and made a motion to donate \$500 dollars to Father Boulus, Alan Brown provided a second.
 - During the course of the discussion Jim Egan rose for a point of order, recommending that due to endemic government corruption that the motion presented be suspended/tabled. Jim believed the Council needed to obtain more information concerning the details of this wire transfer process, in order to ensure the money donated will go directly to Father Boulus.
 - Consequently, Jim then made a motion to suspend/table the original motion until such time as the Council obtains more information on how this is going to work. Dave Petteys provided a second. After some additional discussion the GK called for a vote. The motion to suspend/table the original motion passed with a majority vote.
 - Leonard Leyba said that he would get back to the Council with more information.
