- Lecturer's Reflection/The Rev Robert F. Houlihan S.J. Educator Series Alan Brown/Ben Stancati.
 - Alan's discussion centered on St Joseph. On March 19, less than four months after Pope Francis announced the celebration of the Year of St. Joseph, the Church celebrated the 'Solemnity of St. Joseph,' the highest feast day dedicated to Jesus' foster father and the head of the Holy Family.

Then on May 1, the church celebrated 'The Feast of St. Joseph the Worker.' And besides the March 19 feast day, this is perhaps the most widely known and celebrated feast honoring the foster father of Jesus. While St. Joseph was always known to the Church as a carpenter, the idea of Joseph as a patron of workers took on added significance in the 20th century, when the Church spent much effort combating the atheistic ideas of the communist movement.

At the end of his discussion, Alan then led the members in attendance in reciting the prayer to St. Joseph.


